An October Opportunity Is Yours

On October 11th the Mid-Week Bible Study will resume. This year we will be studying 1 Samuel. I am eager to see how the Lord will use this powerful book to help us grow deeper in our knowledge and love of Him. I hope you will join us as we work our way through this insightful, relevant, and timeless section of Scripture!

Recently, as I began reading through the first eight chapters in preparation for our study, I was reminded how quickly and easily God's people turned away from following wholeheartedly after the Lord. Seemingly overnight they adopted foreign gods and were worshipping them. And it is clear that the Israelites were strongly attracted to the worship of Baal and Ashtaroth, so they erected local high places where sexually oriented and highly charged cult rituals could be practiced.

Tragically, this depraved worship quickly spread, and resulted in Israel's breaking of many of God's commandments including the commandment to have no other god's before Him. Now you need to understand that this way of life was in total opposition to everything Israel should have stood for as the people of God. As God's chosen people they should have known better! Yet, they chose to leave God out of their plans, and as a result they stumbled and fell bringing tremendous suffering on themselves, their children, and their nation.

The first commandment is: "You shall have no other gods before Me. You shall not make for yourself an idol, or any likeness of what is in

heaven above or on the earth beneath or in the waters under the earth. You shall not worship them or serve them; for I, the Lord your God, am a jealous God."

Exodus 20:3-5.

A simple or basic definition of an idol would be that an idol is anyone or anything that takes your focus away from God. Scripture makes it clear that our loyalty and love must first and foremost be given to Him. God must be our #1 priority. While we may not be tempted to worship stone or metal gods, or participate in weird cult rituals, don't be fooled into thinking that you are living in a world devoid of false gods or false worship. Quite the contrary, our world is not a godless world but rather a world that worships that which is false. And when people become enslaved to the worship of these kinds of things, they are dehumanized and destroyed just as quickly as Israel and her neighbor's were.

Now the reality is that we are actually living in a world that is far more driven by idolatry and sensuality then the one the Israelites faced. But the "false gods" and idols that are worshiped today have different names. And may include the worship of things like: self, power, relationships, career, possessions, hobbies, addictive substances, money, beauty, sports, politics, clothing, leisure activities, pornography, television, and on and on it goes.

If you really think about it, it is obvious that we are living in a world that for the most part has lost its bearings because it has abandoned God and it worships the creature rather then the Creator. It is a world that promises personal fulfillment but actually destroys the indi-

vidual because it is based on a distorted anthropology that says material things are more important than people

Studying this portion of scripture caused me to ask "How could someone ever turn away from worshipping the One, true living God, in order to turn to that which is false?" I also wondered why Israel's relationship with God had grown so cold. What happened? More importantly, I was compelled to ask myself: "What must I do to insure that something like that never happens to me or to the ones I love?"


Fortunately, Samuel gave God's people the key to victory. He declared that repentance from idolatry and loyalty toward God are the prerequisites for blessing. Therefore, we must be singularly minded and focused on God and His Word. Folks, we need to allow God to set the pace and the priorities in our lives! We also need to be alert and diligent so that the world will be unable to squeeze us into its mold.

We please the Lord when we maintain an exclusive, loyal relationship to Him. And you know what? God not only demands that He be the priority of our lives.... He <u>deserves</u> to be our #1 priority! God and God alone is the One to whom all praise, honor, worship and glory is due!

So what about you? Any idols? Anything you need to change? Saint's, its never too late to stop where you are and regroup, and then move forward in the strength and power of Almighty God.

As I said earlier, this is a very helpful and practical book! I hope you will join us this Fall, as together we learn how to live more faithfully and fully for the Lord!

What is prayer? The youth in CAD/TNT can tell you. It's being with God. The most common answer people will give is "Talking to God". Some will say "communicating with God" which is better because it implies a two way conversation as it should be. Listening for a response from our Creator while praying is always desirable, but as we know, it doesn't always come. One reason is our impatience. We are in a hurry and not willing to wait. Another is distractions that come in many forms. Outside noise, electronic devices, the ever present busyness in our minds and so on. Solitude and silence is golden in personal prayer time.

Another thing the students have been learning and is very applicable to all of us is found in a book by Kenneth Boa called "Face to Face, Praying the Scriptures for Intimate Worship". In it, he guides us through the process of praying Scripture back to God. It enables us to think Gods thoughts after Him and to personalize them in our thinking and practice. It also provides us with a balanced prayer experience. Boa uses eight forms seen in The Lords Prayer (Matthew 6: 9-13). They are adoration, confession, renewal, petition, intercession, affirmation, thanksgiving, and closing prayer

For myself, <u>adoration</u> is a must. It sets my mind on to Whom, exactly, I am praying. Jeremiah 32:17: "Lord God! behold, You have made the heavens and the earth by your great power and by your outstretched arm! Nothing is to difficult for you." This is The Almighty God to Whom I am Praying and growing my personal relationship with through prayer. We are so, so fortunate to have a God who wants this relationship with us. Praise the Lord! He is truly amazing.

The next part, confession, is one most of us forget to do or choose to skip for many reasons. Either we think we don't sin, which is impossible because of our sin nature. Or we might be afraid of the consequences of our sin and think if we don't tell Him we might get away with it, which is also impossible. For what ever the reason, it is important to confess so

that we don't create separation from our Heavenly Father.

Renewal is next and is also a neglected part of prayer. "And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one." The necessity of renewal as we face the temptations of the world, the flesh and the devil. Please Lord deliver us as we cannot do it without You.

Petition and intercession we seem to be the best at. Asking God things for ourselves and others. I think this part requires more thought than we normally give it. First our requests have to be in His will. Our motivation in our prayer asking is huge. We should examine our motivation carefully to see if it is His will or our selfish wishful desires. Every thing we ask should be for our Great God's glory.

The principle of <u>affirmation</u> is agreeing with God's will and submitting to it. "Your kingdom come your will be done on earth as it is in heaven". Simple to say, hard to do, we will keep working on it. Agreed?

The next part is the easiest at least for me. Thanksgiving goes hand in hand with the first part, "adoration". There are uncountable reasons to thank the LORD. Life itself, how He keeps our heart beating until He decides to stop it. His breath that becomes ours, His never ending love and faithfulness. Eternal hope, strength, example for life here on earth and on and on and on.

The <u>closing prayer</u> is where it really takes off. You apply all the other parts into your heart and mind and let the Holy Spirit lead you into a fulfilling "Time with God". That will leave you with a peace beyond all understanding.

Of course how you pray is completely between you and God. I have found this method in one form or another to be very helpful. We all know that prayer is important but making the time to actually do it is just as important and so, so rewarding.

We have an "Awesome God", not just a song but a fact. As in many times before while I am preparing for a class or writing an article such as this His giving nature comes out. It has been on my heart to write something for "First Edition" for a couple of months now. I just didn't know the subject.

So He used a suggestion from Pastor Marc to give me the subject: "Prayer", something that is near and dear to my heart. His giving didn't stop there, while praying and prepping, His word and more than one devotional talked about, you guessed it: "Prayer!" I would like to share part of one with you.

From "Experiencing God Day by Day" by Henry and Richard Blackaby. Sept. 13. "Prayer is Preparation":

'Prayer does not give you spiritual power. Prayer aligns your life with God so that so that He chooses to demonstrate His power through you. The purpose of prayer is not to convince God to change your circumstances but to prepare you to be involved in God's activity.

"The fervent prayer of the people at Pentecost did not induce the Holy Spirit to come upon them. Prayer brought them to a place where they were ready to participate in the mighty work God had already planned.

"Prayer is designed to adjust you to God's will not to adjust God to your will. If God has not responded to what you are praying you may need to adjust your praying to align with God's agenda. Rather than focusing on what you would like to see happen, realize that God may be more concerned with what He wants to see happen in you."

Just a word about corporate prayer or praying out loud with others. Many people are afraid to do this and won't. First of all God's word tells us 365 times "Do not be afraid." When you pray with others it develops a unity among His believers. It also opens your heart to the concerns of your brothers and sisters. It provides perspectives other than your own. There are many other positive reasons for corporate prayer, so step out and do it.

I would like to close with a prayer. "Oh Lord God, thank You that You desire to hear our prayers. AMEN."
