The Joy of Knowing Jesus

"Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a huge crowd of witnesses to the life of faith, let us strip off every weight that slows us down, especially the sin that so easily trips us up. And let us run with endurance the race God has set before us. We do this by keeping our eyes on Jesus, the champion who initiates and perfects our faith. Because of the joy awaiting Him, He endured the cross, disregarding its shame.

"Now He is seated in the place of honor beside God's throne. Think of all the hostility He endured from sinful people; then you won't become weary and give up. After all, you have not yet given your lives in your struggle against sin. And have you forgotten the encouraging words God spoke to you as his children? He said,

"My child, don't make light of the Lord's discipline, and don't give up when he corrects you. For the Lord disciplines those he loves, and he punishes each one he accepts as his child."

Hebrews 12:1-6 NLT

This Easter season, the passage in Hebrews took on new and deeper meaning for me in light of all the events we shared together. When I considered what Jesus did for me and why, it became clearer that He endured the cross keeping in mind something amazing and wonderful that was going to happen because of His own suffering. The "joy awaiting him" or as it says in other translations, "the joy set before Him" was not only about returning to heaven and being back with His Father.

Jesus already had that in heaven. He is perfect and complete in himself, He is overflowingly happy in the eternal fellowship of the Trinity, and he does not need us and is not deficient without us. And yet He still willingly chose to come for us.

So, since He already had perfect joy in heaven within Himself (Father, Son, Holy Spirit), what was the "joy" that brought Him to take on flesh and be born human? What was the "joy" that sustained Him through His life and ministry here on earth? What was the "joy" that was before Him as He endured the shame, scorn, pain and suffering of the cross? Clearly the joy that awaited Him was the joy of bringing us along with Him into the Father's presence. It was His great joy to love us and include us in His glory. That thought amazes me and makes me want to love Him so much more.

It's this passage that calls us to keep this in mind as we serve Him. He endured everything because He kept our future together in mind. And so should we!

Remember how much He endured and suffered. Know that we have never come close to experiencing the kind of suffering He did. Perhaps some have experienced the pain of execution, maybe even sufferings that may have lasted longer, been worse. But none who experienced the pain of separation from the Father and weight of the sins of the world placed upon His shoulders. We need to remember that. There is a possibility that we too could suffered

extreme persecution for our faith, and it could possibly be comparable in a way to what Jesus physically endured on the cross, but in those moments we can count on the power and presence of the Holy Spirit to strengthen, uphold, and inspire us. Jesus had to bear this

The affects of remembering His suffering for us, according to this passage, are that we will then be motivated to discard sin and keep our hearts and minds engaged with Jesus. We can even know that what we endure is His loving discipline for our growth and His glory.

When things get tough, or we are discouraged, is God at the forefront of our hearts? When life takes its turns in the directions we don't expect or desire, or even when things seem to be going great and everything fits, is Jesus is our joy? No matter the circumstance, He is what life is all about. With Him leading and directing, everything fits, even when we don't understand. He knows exactly what is best and what is needed in every situation.

So let us together keep our eyes fixed firmly on Jesus, the One who authored and is perfecting our faith in Him. We know that in our heads. But whether we truly LIVE this out in a personal real relationship with Him is proved true only by our lives. Are we filled with stress, worry, and concern? Do we function like He is right here with us, every second? Do we trust His love for us combined with His presence, power and authority?

A Unique and Lovely Description of Our Lord.

Submitted by Doris Waddell I've been so impacted reading John Piper's book, "God Is the Gospel" that I wanted to share a short passage with you.

"The glory of God in the life and ministry of Jesus was not the blinding glory that we sill see when he comes the second time with "his face . . . like the sun shining in full strength" (Rev. 1:16; cf Luke 9:29). His glory, in his first coming, was the incomparable exquisite array of spiritual, moral, intellectual, verbal, and practical perfections that manifest themselves in a kind of meek miracle-working and unanswerable teaching and humble action that set Jesus apart from all men.

"What I am trying to express here is that the glory of Christ, as he appeared among us, consisted not in one attribute or another, and not in one act or another, but in what Jonathan Edwards called 'an admirable0 conjunction of diverse excellencies.' In a sermon titled 'The Excellency of Christ' Edwards took as his text Revelation 5:5-6 where Christ is compared both to a lion and a lamb. His point was that the unique glory of Christ was that such diverse excellencies (lion and lamb) unite in him. These excellencies are so diverse that they 'would have seemed to us utterly incompatible in the same subject.' In other words.

- we admire him for his glory, but even more because his glory is mingled with humility;
- we admire him for his transcendence, but even more because his transcendence is accompanied by condescension:
- we admire him for his majesty, but even more because it is a majesty in meekness;
- we admire him because of his equality with God, but even more because as God's equal he nevertheless has a deep reverence for God.
- We admire him because of how worthy he was of all the good, but even more because this was accompanied by an amazing patience to suffer evil;
- we admire him because of his sovereign dominion over the world,

but even more because this dominion was clothed with spirit of obedience and submission:

- we love the way he stumped the proud scribes with his wisdom, and we love it even more because he could be simple enough to like children and spend time with them;
- and we admire him because he could still the storm, but even more because he refused to use that power to strike the Samaritans with lightning (Luke 9:54-55) and he refused to use it to get himself down from the cross.

"The list could go on and on. But this is enough to illustrate that beauty and excellency in Christ is not a simple thing. It is complex. It is a coming together in one person of the perfect balance and proportion of extremely diverse qualities. And that's what makes Jesus Christ uniquely glorious, excellent, and admirable. The human heart was made to stand in awe of such ultimate excellence. We were made to admire Jesus Christ, the Son of God."

How can we not admire and love Him? Can you read this without pausing to worship?


