TOTAL SURRENDER

"And when they had brought their boats to land, they left everything and followed Him." Luke 5:11

The disciples had just witnessed Jesus' mighty powers. They had been out fishing all day and yet, within their own expertise and strength, these capable fishermen did not catch a single fish. They they came face-to-face with the Lord, who with one command, delivered such a great catch that their seaworthy boats began to sink under the load. The disciples were astonished and in awe. Upon Jesus' invitation they immediately left everything - their catch, possessions, careers and families - to follow the Master fisherman.

Think back to when you first personally encountered Jesus. When He said to "Follow Me," what did you do? Did you stop and consider His offer? Did you discuss your terms of surrener? Or did you simply jump out of your sinking boat as fast as you could? Can you remember that feeling of being cleansed and made white as snow? Do you remember the excitement and peace that came over you when you first set your feet on the Rock? Do you remember packing anything before you left your boat?

Many people jump out of their boats, eager and intent on follow-

ing Christ. But when He says to us, "Follow Me," how many of us actually leave everything behind and follow? How many inwittingly hang on to material obsessions, ungodly relationships, crippling emotions, incorrect perceptions of God, or personal habits that are less than glorifying to the Lord? Probably every one of us has fallen into the latter boat in one way or another. No one is made perfect at the time of conversion. We all carry luggage from distant shores that we must, over time, learn to let go of, if we are to grow and mature in Christ.

The writer of Hebrews said in 12:1-2: "Therefore, since we have so great a cloud of witnesses surrounding us, let us also lay aside every encumbrance, and the sin which so easily entangles us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith."

Jesus desires that we keep in step with Him, that we run to win; but in order to keep up we must lay aside those encumbrances! Don't be afraid to ask the Lord for the strength to look deep within yourself and to take stock of what you are carrying. I have discovered that it is a lot easier to run with Him when I'm not carrying unnecessary stuff. If you're like me, you'll

probably discover a few things that need to be off loaded in order to run full speed. But it is comforting to know that when I do find myself bogged down with the things of life, Jesus does not just leave me behind. Rather, He circles around to help me out. By faith, I know that He is always there, eager to help. The key question is: will I let Him or choose to rely on myself?

Jesus encourages each of us, "Come to Me, all who are weary and heavy-laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from Me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you shall find rest for your souls. For My yoke is easy and My load is light." (Matrthew 11:28-30)

Jesus gently beckons you andme to surrender all our burdens. our past hurts and fears, our whole lives to Him. Instead of wasting time and energy resisting Him, it is best to let go. While letting go is sometimes very difficult and painful, take heart - the Lord promises to be our strength and our comfort. Take heart, for we are His workmanship and He promises to make us perfect and complete. He can and will change us! Be confident of this very thing, that He who has begun a good work in you will complete it.

Their ministry has really grown and they've been able to effectively grow in places impossible for missionaries to go by doing ministry in other ways: providing material assistance enabling persecuted Christians to procalim the Gospel and plant churches in 43 hostile countries. 94% of their budget goes to their work in these hostile countries and serves specifically to the needs of each.

In their booklet, "Stories from the Persevering", one of the missionaries who has been imprisoned twice, now serving a 10-15 sentence and his wife currently serving a 5-year prison sentence, was aked why, after he had traveled to be involved in a family event, he decided to returned to the place where he knew the risks that he would face. And his response was:

"Christians are light, and light is most necessary where there is dark."

One statement Pastor Marc said in his sermon on July 15th has made me think about something I hadn't really been aware of before! I've always looked forward to being with God in heaven, but when Pastor said God wants us to be with Him, something in my mind turned to worship! I hadn't really given much thought to any desire He had for us to be with Him!

It's amazing when one "new" truth is connected to another truth I've never understood fully. As I was reading John 11:35 where it says, "Jesus wept", I realized I had always wondered why He would weep when He knew He was going to bring Lazarus back to life. And then the words of Pastor's sermon came to me. Jesus wept because of the sorrow that Mary was experiencing. As I was meditating on this, I remembered the prophesy in Isaiah 53 - "a Man of sorrow" and I wondered: "Did Jesus weep with me when I lost my husband?" "Does Jesus weep over all the lost people, who are weeping, because His heart sees their misery?" May 26th to June 10th, Audrey and I stayed in the dorms at UC Berkeley with 18 others at the Bridges Summer Mission. Audrey was the Operations Director and I helped with the Food Team. Basically, we worked on the two jobs together and things went smoothly. 
