LOVE IS THE CENTERPIECE

In 1 Corinthians, Chapter 13, the Apostle Paul proclaims the excellent superiority of love and at the end of the chapter in verse 13, he writes: but now faith, hope, love abide these three; but the greatest of these is love.

As I reflected on this beautiful section of Scripture I was reminded yet again of the central or preeminent role that love is intended to play in the lives of God's people. There is simply no getting around the fact that love should be a defining characteristic in the life of the believer.

Now the more I thought about this chapter, especially verse 13, it occurred to me that these three words; faith, hope and love represent the basics or fundamental guiding principles of the Christian life.

In our world today, faith is a word that expresses confidence or a belief in someone or something, but it's not necessarily a strongly held conviction, nor are people dependent on that in which they place their faith. But for the Christian, the object of our faith is Almighty God, Creator of Heaven and Earth. The word faith is not only descriptive of our ongoing, dynamic relationship with God, but it also expresses our dependence on Him.

Faith is all about relationship and it is the very foundation on which our lives in Christ are built.

To the world, the word hope speaks of something that is desired that may or may not occur. However, when the word hope appears in the New Testament, it's always centered on God and the basis for our hope is found in the gracious work of God in Jesus Christ. Therefore, our hope is based on something that is solid, and it should bring the expectation of something good. Hope allows us to be confident and certain in an uncertain world. Hope is the assurance that the One we love and in whom we place our faith is alive and we can be certain that we will spend eternity with Him.

Scripture makes it very plain that a distinguishing characteristic of a true follower of Jesus Christ is love for God and love for others, even those who are difficult. I believe that you can't have hope or faith

By Pastor Marc Heinz until you first love as God commands. In 1 John 4:7-22 we read:

Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God; and everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. The one who does not love does not know God, for God is love. By this the love of God was manifested in us, that God has sent His only begotten Son into the world so that we might live through Him. In this is love, not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son to be the propitiation for our sins. Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. No one has seen God at any time: if we love one another. God abides in us, and His love is perfected in us. By this we know that we abide in Him and He in us. because He has given us of His Spirit. We have seen and testify that the Father has sent the Son to be the Savior of the world. Whoever confesses that Jesus is the Son of God. God abides in him. and he in God. We have come to know and have believed the love, which God has for us. God is love. and the one who abides in love abides in God, and God abides in him. By this, love is perfected with us, so that we may have confidence in the day of judgment; because as He is, so also are we in this world. There is no fear in love; but perfect love casts out fear, because fear involves punishment, and the one who fears is not perfected in love. We love, because He first loved us. If someone says, "I love God," and hates his brother, he is a liar: for the one who does not love his brother whom he has seen, cannot love God whom he has not seen. And this commandment we have from Him. that the one who loves God should love his brother also.

In John's day, love was either a philosophical concept or a positive attraction to someone or something. There were four different words used by the Greeks to describe love. Now when the early Christians wanted to describe what they experienced in Jesus' love they took the weakest of these Greek words - agape - and ascribed a new meaning to it. This word's meaning is fully developed in 1 John. But in essence, it

means a commitment to care, regardless of reciprocity or reception. I would guess that this definition of love is much different then the way many Christians today would define love. Because love, Jesus' style, demands that we care for those who hurt us or treat us badly. Our love is to be modeled after Jesus, who loved those who mocked Him, spit on Him and even killed Him. On the cross Jesus was the epitome of Christian love.

Love is the centerpiece for all Christian existence and experience. And in 1 John we are told to receive God's love and then pass it on, as widely and effectively as possible. In a sense, love is to be cyclical in nature. If we would simply recognize God's great love for us and live in that reality it would change everything!

If you let it, God's love will not only change you but it will transform your relationships. It will shape you and mold you. It will be evident in your speech and all your dealings with other people. But it all begins by developing a personal relationship with God and allowing Him and His Word to shape your life. It's making love for God your priority.


In Revelation 2 the church at Ephesus is described. The Ephesian church was an active church, busy in the service of God and people. It was famous for its hard work, diligence and conscientiousness. It is the kind of church most of us would love to be a part of. Yet in Revelation 2:4 it was charged by Jesus with losing it's first love, God. And this was so significant that they were in jeopardy of losing everything they had.

We dare not be naive and think that we can allow anyone or anything other than God to be our priority and not face the same consequences that the church at Ephesus did. Folks, gaining or losing that first love is the key to life and death.

So when you examine the basic fundamentals of your life, what do you see? Are you on track? Is your heart undivided? Is the Lord truly your first love? Are you growing in faith, hope and love? Let's be people who not only understand the basics of the Christian life, let's be people who want to put them into practice each and every day! Amen?

About the Shelter Ministry

Just thought I would pass along the following report so that you would know what happened with our giving and how it was received.

Report on Christmas Giving Outreaches, 2013 InnVision Shelter Network Vendrome Program, Second Avenue, San Mateo

On a beautiful sunny day, the 17th of December, I delivered six gift cards to this facility. The person I had contacted turned out to be a man who was raking leaves in front of the building

When I arrived I gave him the box that held small gift bags and envelopes with the gift certificates inside. This gentleman was all smiles and was extremely grateful for our generosity.

I had been asked to deliver the gifts on this day as they were going to be distributed at their holiday party that very afternoon.

InnVision Maple Street Single Adult Shelter, Redwood City on the 18th of December

I drove to Redwood City, turned left onto Maple Street off Veterans Boulevard, and continued to wind my way back and forth to the shelter where there were groups of people talking in front of the building which was surrounded by a construction site. As I spotted the address, a young woman left the group of ladies with whom she was chatting to speak to me. When she confirmed that I was delivering gifts (nine gifts plus some gift cards) she began to smile. She asked a man to bring a cart and when he left to do that, she started collecting the bags of gifts I had brought with me.

Soon she had all the bags divided between her hands and sent the cart back when it arrived. She hugged me two times, thanking me for our generosity. She said that so many times the adults are forgotten at Christmas; people would rather give to children.

Single Woman with Three Girls living in an apartment on Amphlett in San Mateo

This lady had contacted Samaritan House about being put on a list to receive Christmas gifts, but they had already closed that program. Evidently they gave her a list of churches, and that is how she contacted us. So on December 23rd I took the gifts we had collected for this family. The young woman was thrilled when she saw me walk down the hall of the apartment as she had been watching for me. She explained that she and the girls have been living here for the last three years and been given some subsidies by county programs.

She takes the girls to school each morning on the bus since she has no other transportation. She works part time at a 7-Eleven that is located close by. This lady expressed a faith in God, said that she prays and knows that God hears her. She indicated that she would like to start going to a church and get the girls involved. I handed her a bulletin from FBC, along with my phone number, and said that we would be happy to give her a ride to church. The girls seemed very excited to open the gifts and most likely did so as soon as I left.

We gave each girl some items of warm clothing as well as a toy or gift card. We also gave the woman a gift card.

Support for Families at FBC

We also collected funds for an individual and a family at FBC. I don't know what the final outcome was, but I believe the individual was given at least one gift card, and the family was given some funds and maybe some gift cards.

I praise God for the way He used our congregation to bless others in need during this Christmas Season. It was such a blessing to see the love and generosity of believers in this body.


