

WORSHIP ANEW

Fall is a great time for kicking off new ministries and new direction. This summer the Lord has had us in the worship ministry spend time together on Wednesday nights in prayer and worship, seeking the Lord's presence and direction for the ministry. Here's some things that the Lord has been showing us in anticipation for our fall launch of the worship ministry:

♦ Our individual spiritual lives are intertwined with the movement of the worship ministry and the church.

The strength, purpose, and vitality of the worship ministry comes from our personal relationship with God Himself. From our individual spiritual lives flows our personal worship (awe of Him and harmony with Him), and from that spills over into our corporate worship of Him. As Ravi Zacharias told us in our spring retreat, "If you are not worshipping Him individually, you cannot worship Him corporately, and if you are not worshipping Him corporately, how can we expect to lead His people authentically."

So are you spending time with Him daily in personal worship? Are you experiencing Him in all the ways that He wants you to and are possible in Him? God has really been challenging me to change and go deeper in my time with Him. If this is how you want to grow, then the worship ministry is the place for you.

→ He wants to have the ministry serve His purpose and leading.

He wants control. He deserves control. And He wants the right to say and do what He wants. So are we willing to go where He says, and do what He says? God has been challenging me that I have to be ready to move when and where He wants, even in the middle of worship services. This week we've purchased a new computer and new software for the sanctuary from funds the Lord provided years ago. The new program is a full multi-media software that integrates our song database with the presentation software. It's like PowerPoint with all the songs loaded and ready to go. Now we can more easily flex and change songs when we believe God is calling us to change in our service. Each musician also now has a full binder

But even as we make these changes, our hearts need to be ready and receptive to whatever He wants in our lives. Again this is not just a Sunday/ Wednesday worship attitude/technique, but a lifestyle lived in Christ. If this is how you want to grow in your relationship with the Lord then the worship ministry is the place for you.

♦ We have to be willing to forsake it all to follow Him and please Him above all others. We need to give Him a blank canvas to paint on.

It is our goal as worship leaders to get out of the people pleasing business and become more in the God pleasing business. This has always been a struggle for me personally. But to get where He wants, things need to change. Starting with me. We need to put in the time and effort that is needed, devotionally with God and in our preparation for worship. I don't believe this is complicated or that we need to make things more technical or difficult. Most of us still can't even read music. But, we love the Lord and take His call seriously.

♦ We are called to reflect the joy and love of the Lord.

As we grow in our connection and love for God, this spills over into our worship together. And one of the greatest joys for us is that we get to do this together as a family. We're looking forward to a fall retreat and fellowship events as we begin this new year. And we are being called to be an open ministry to anyone who God is leading to join.

We all in the worship ministry are excited about these changes. And we pray that as we obey His word and His leading, He will move in His church! I know that together as we seek Him we will get to see Him use us to do amazing things for the Kingdom!!! Come join us and experience what God's doing in the worship ministry.

We are continuing to meet after the Wednesday night services in the choir room to pray and worship together, giving our hearts to God. These times have been powerful and bonding.

- . . . after the baby arrives, demanding more of you than you ever dreamed possible
- . . . after you find a pink slip with your final paycheck.
- . . . after your family and friends have heard your story one too many times, but you still need to talk it out.

Devotions on Prayer

THE PURPOSE OF PRAYER:

Prayer is not a normal part of the life of the natural man. We hear it said that a person's life will suffer if he doesn't pray, but I question that. What will suffer is the life of the Son of God in him, which is nourished not by food, but by prayer. When a person is born again from above, the life of the Son of God is born in him, and he can either starve or nourish that life. Prayer is the way the life of God is nourished. . . .

To say that "prayer changes things" is not as close to the truth as saying, "Prayer changes *me* and then I change things." God has established things so that prayer, on th basis of redemption, changes the way a person looks at things. Prayer is not a matter of changing things externally, but one of working miracles in a person's inner nature.

PERSISTENT PRAYER:

"And he said, I beseech thee, shew me thy glory." (Exodus 33:18 KJV) Refer [first] to the thirteenth verse of this chapter, where Moses speaks to God: "Now therefore, I pray thee, if I have found grace in your sight, shew me now your way." Moses asked a lesser favor before he requested the greater. He asked to see God's way before he prayed to see His glory.

This is the true manner of prayer. Do not be content with past answers, but double your request and ask again. Nothing pleases God as much as when a sinner comes again with twice as large a petition: "Lord, You heard me last time, and now I come again." Faith is a mighty grace and always grows upon that which it feeds. When God has heard prayer for one thing, faith comes and asks for two things, and when God has given those two things, faith asks for six.

Faith can scale the walls of heaven. She is a giant grace. She takes mountains by their roots and puts them on other mountains and so climbs to the throne in confidence with large petitions, knowing that she shall not be refused. Most of us are too slow to go to God. If we have been heard once, we go away instead of coming again and again, and each time with a larger prayer.

Make your petitions longer and longer. Ask for ten and if God gives them, then for a thousand, and keep going on until at last you will have enough faith to ask as great a favor as Moses did, "I beseech you, show me your glory."
