

A Biblical Response to the Age of Disclosure

Introduction

We are living in what many commentators call the Age of Disclosure. Government agencies, military pilots, and journalists continue to discuss unidentified anomalous phenomena (UAPs). The U.S. Department of Defense All-domain Anomaly Resolution Office (AARO) stated in its 2024 historical report that investigators found no verified evidence of extraterrestrial technology or off-world visitation.

Yet the fascination remains. Are UAPs alien spacecraft? Are they secret military technologies? Are some experiences psychological? Could some manifestations be spiritual in nature?

As believers, our authority is not speculation but Scripture. Psalm 119:105 says, "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path."

Today, we will discover three truths:

1. God created a vast invisible world populated by spiritual entities.
2. Satan, fallen angels, and demons are real and actively deceive humanity.
3. Whatever UAPs may be, Christians need not fear because Jesus Christ reigns over every power in heaven and on earth.

I. The Invisible World Is Real

Colossians 1:16 says, "For by him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible... all things were created through him and for him."

The Bible teaches that reality includes both:

- The visible world we can observe.
- The invisible world of spiritual beings.

Ephesians 6:12 reminds us, "For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against... the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places."

The greatest battle is not in the skies above us but in the spiritual realm around us.

II. Holy Angels: God's Mighty Messengers

Psalm 148:2, 5 declares that angels were created by God.

Hebrews 1:14 calls them "ministering spirits sent out to serve for the sake of those who are to inherit salvation." (Hebrews 13:2)

Examples:

- Gabriel announced the births of John the Baptist and Jesus (Luke 1:11-38).

- Angels ministered to Jesus after His temptation (Matthew 4:11).
- Angels announced the resurrection (Matthew 28:2-7).

Psalm 103:20 says angels are “mighty ones who do his word.”

Yet angels are not to be worshiped. Revelation 22:8-9 records an angel telling John, “Worship God.”

III. Satan: The Great Counterfeiter

Isaiah 14:12-15 and Ezekiel 28:12-17 are often understood to describe the pride and fall of Satan. Jesus said in John 8:44 that the devil “is a liar and the father of lies.”

Revelation 12:9 calls him “the deceiver of the whole world.”

Satan's strategy is counterfeit:

- Counterfeit truth.
- Counterfeit miracles.
- Counterfeit spirituality.
- Counterfeit peace.

2 Corinthians 11:14 warns, “Even Satan disguises himself as an angel of light.”

IV. Demons and Their Work of Deception

Demons and fallen angels are aligned with Satan.

Revelation 12:4 symbolically describes a third of the stars being cast down.

1 Timothy 4:1 says some will follow “deceitful spirits and teachings of demons.”

Demons can:

- Possess and/or Oppress (Mark 5:1-20).
- Deceive (Revelation 16:14).
- Promote false religion (1 Corinthians 10:20).
- Encourage end-times apostasy (2 Thessalonians 2:9-12).

The Bible never presents believers as helpless victims. James 4:7 says, “Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.”

V. The Last Days and Escalating Deception

Jesus warned in Matthew 24:24:

“False christs and false prophets will arise and perform great signs and wonders.”

2 Thessalonians 2:9-10 describes the Antichrist as coming “with all power and false signs and wonders.”

Revelation 13:13-14 says the False Prophet “performs great signs, even making fire come down from heaven.”

The closer we get to Christ's return, the more persuasive deception will become.

VI. What Are UAPs? A Biblical Framework

The Bible does not mention UAPs directly. We should be cautious and avoid dogmatism.

A balanced biblical framework allows several possibilities:

1. Misidentification of natural phenomena.
2. Secret or advanced human technology.
3. Psychological or perceptual experiences.
4. Hoaxes and exaggerations.
5. In some cases, possible demonic deception.

Because demons and fallen angels can perform signs and wonders, Christians should not automatically interpret extraordinary experiences as evidence of extraterrestrial civilizations.

The core issue is theological: If an experience leads people away from the uniqueness of Christ and the authority of Scripture, it is spiritually dangerous.

Galatians 1:8 says that even if “an angel from heaven” proclaims another gospel, he is accursed.

VII. Why the Alien Narrative Captivates the Modern Mind

The world longs for salvation but rejects the Savior.

Many people hope:

- Superior beings will solve humanity's problems.
- Technology will usher in peace.
- Hidden knowledge will enlighten mankind.

Yet Scripture says only Jesus Christ can reconcile humanity to God.

Acts 4:12 declares, “There is salvation in no one else.”

The longing for cosmic rescue is real. The answer is not extraterrestrial intelligence but the incarnate Son of God.

VIII. Jesus Christ Is Supreme Over Every Power

Colossians 2:15 says Christ, “disarmed the rulers and authorities and put them to open shame.”

Ephesians 1:20-21 states that Jesus is seated “far above all rule and authority and power and dominion.”

1 Peter 3:22 says that angels, authorities, and powers have been subjected to Him.

No demon can overrule Him.

No deception can dethrone Him.

No mystery in the heavens can challenge His sovereignty.

2 Timothy 3:16-17.

2. Test Every Spirit.

1 John 4:1-3.

3. Refuse Fear.

2 Timothy 1:7.

4. Put on the Armor of God.

Ephesians 6:10-18.

5. Keep Your Eyes on Christ.

Hebrews 12:2.

X. The Ultimate Disclosure Is the Return of Jesus Christ

The greatest revelation in history is not disclosure from the Pentagon, but the appearing of the King of kings.

Revelation 19:11 says, “Then I saw heaven opened, and behold, a white horse!”

Every eye will see Him (Revelation 1:7).

Every knee will bow (Philippians 2:10-11).

Satan will be bound (Revelation 20:1-3).

Christ will reign for one thousand years (Revelation 20:4-6).

The world is looking for beings from the stars.

The church is waiting for the Bright Morning Star (Revelation 22:16).

The greatest question is not, "Are we alone?"

The greatest question is, "Do you know Jesus Christ?"

Romans 3:23 says all have sinned.

Romans 6:23 says the wages of sin is death.

Romans 5:8 says Christ died for us.

Romans 10:9 says whoever confesses Jesus as Lord and believes in His resurrection will be saved.

If you have never trusted Christ, turn to Him today.
