Happy Eastertide by PAUL ANLEITNER

While we have just made our way through the journey of the Lenten season, the commemoration of Good Friday, and the celebration of the Resurrection on Easter Sunday, Christians have historically designated Easter Sunday as the start of a 50-day period of celebration called Eastertide. While there are a number of important implications for what Christ's resurrection means for us, here is just one I want to invite you to ruminate on this Eastertide.

The Gospel authors and the early church witnesses go to great lengths to make it abundantly clear that the resurrected Christ was not just some spiritual ghost floating around. He was bodily raised. He ate meals with people (Luke 24:36-43). He invited people to touch him (John 20:24-29). While they wouldn't have used a term auite like this, the resurrected body of Jesus was made of matter.

For the earliest followers of Jesus, Christ's bodily resurrection meant that God is not calling us to escape our material

What these apostles consistently celebrate is that in raising Jesus from the dead, God has vindicated The Way of Jesus as the way that leads to life, demonstrating Jesus is Lord and not Caesar. They boldly announce that a new era of renewal in creation has begun in Christ. Even if our bodies break down before that work of renewal is completed

bodies and the material world we live in because God is restoring and redeeming his creation, including our flesh and blood bodies. What we do here in the world and who we are right here and now have value that is not going to be discarded but transformed. You are not biding your time waiting for a disembodied afterlife while the world falls apart. In fact, if you go through the entire book of Acts (which takes place after the Resurrection) and look at every public sermon given by the apostles, you'll notice how the apostles do not focus on what happens to you when you die. Instead, their preaching is centered on how the Resurrection brings the rule of heaven to earth.

in creation, we will be raised to life like Christ in a fully redeemed creation to receive the reward for co-laboring with Him in this world. Because Christ, as fully God and fully human, is the only "forever person," we become "forever people" too through the union of our nature to his by grace through faith (Ephesians 2:8-10).

Everything you and I do in this world matters because God is not abandoning or destroying the world just to beam us out of here. "Behold, I make all things new" is the promise of God to us and the whole of creation (Revelation 21:5).
