# NEVERTHELESS, THERE IS REASON TO HOPE

One of the commencement traditions at Harvard University is Senior Class Chapel. On the morning of their graduation, seniors gather in Memorial Church to hear the minister offer words of solace and encouragement as they leave "the Yard" to take their places in the world.

The 1998 senior class heard the unvarnished truth from the Rev. Peter Gomes, minister at Harvard. In his gentle ringing tones, Dr. Gomes took no prisoners as he began:

"You are going to be sent out of here for good, and most of you aren't ready to go. The president is about to bid you into the fellowship of educated men and women and."—and here he paused and spoke each word slowly for emphasis, "you know just-how-dumb-you-really-are."

The senior class cheered in agreement.

"And worse than that," Dr. Gomes continued, "the world—and your parents in particular—are going to expect that you will be among the brightest and best. But you know that you can no longer fool all the people even some of the time. By noontime today, you will be out of here. By tomorrow you will be history. By Saturday, you will be toast. That's a fact. No exceptions, no extensions."

"Nevertheless, there is reason to hope! . . ."

That is the message of Easter!

The honest truth is that when we are honest with ourselves, we all recognize the fact that we fall short of God's glory, that we all are sinners, and that we all are "toast". There are no exceptions.

But the message of the resurrection of Jesus is, "Nevertheless, there is reason to hope!" Not in ourselves, but in Jesus Christ, the King. The one who conquered death, and offered God's forgiveness and opened the way of salvation for each of us.

First and foremost, we are Easter people. As Easter people we have an Easter gospel, a gospel which means good news every day of the week and every day of the year.

In this edition of "First Word" we are focusing on the resurrection. Paul in 1 Corinthians 15 tells us that the resurrection is "of first importance." And so during this month of April we are going to come back to the message again and again, "Nevertheless, there is reason to hope!"

# **GOD'S FUTURE IN OUR PRESENT**

Now if Christ is proclaimed as raised from the dead, how can some of you say that there is no resurrection of the dead?

One thing that we share with Jesus' contemporaries is that we too long for God's promised future. We long for the time when God will "set things to rights," when He will do justice, when evil will be swept away. We long for the time when God will free creation from corruption and make all things new. And like many of Jesus' Jewish contemporaries, we long for the time when we will be made new-resurrected, and able again to dwell in the presence of our God.

For us, as for them, the bulk of that still lies in the future, with one notable exception—Jesus is risen! And this is part of what made that first Easter so shocking. Jesus' followers may have been expecting a resurrection, but—like us—they expected it to happen in God's future. Just like us, Jesus followers expected the resurrection to happen all at once, everyone together, along with everything else that accompanies God's future. So imagine their surprise when they found that Jesus had been resurrected right now, in their present, before the judgement, before the renewal of creation, and of course before all of the rest of us.

Once Jesus' physical, bodily resurrection could no longer be doubted (even by Thomas), there remained only one possible conclusion to draw: God's future had broken into their present! If resurrection is part of God's future, and Jesus is in fact risen, then God's future was here. The disciples may not have always been quick studies, but even they could follow that logic. There may still be plenty of work for God to do, but there could be no doubt that work had started. And who could doubt it? After all. He is risen!

Jesus' resurrection is God's future in our present, proof that our hope is not in vain. We know that God's great and beautiful future is not just a pipe dream because it is no longer just in the future, it has broken into our present as well. We know God can and will do what He has promised because He is already doing what He has promised. And we know that one day we too will be raised from dead. As Paul might ask, How could we doubt it—Jesus is risen!
