# Seeking God's Face BY JOEL SUTTON

What if God were on Facebook? What would his profile page look like?

If he approached Facebook the way most of us do, John Ortberg suggests it might look like this:

#### THE DEITY

**Relationship status:** Triune and serenely blissful

Number of friends: I only know

**Unfriended:** List currently blocked

**Photos:** None available (see second commandment)

**Timeline:** From the beginning—Created the world, didn't I?

What's on your mind?: What isn't?

Recent posts: My book is still the all-time bestseller and the bestseller every year. Now have billions of worshipers. What ever happened to Zeus?

Isn't it good that God is not on Facebook? Praise God that we are called to seek His face, not His facebook.

David in Psalm 27 yearning for intimate communion with God writes, "One thing have I asked of the Lord, that will I seek after: that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life, to gaze upon the beauty of the Lord . . . . You have said, "Seek my face", My heart says to you, "Your face, Lord, do I seek." (vs. 4, 8).

The Hebrew word for "face" in the Old Testament is often translated "presence." When we seek the face of God, we are seeking His presence. We are seeking to really know Him.

What comes to your mind when you think about God?

In his book <u>Soul Searching</u>, Christian Smith summarizing perceptions about God that are prevalent in the church and in contemporary culture today says that most young evangelicals believe in what could best be described as "moral, therapeutic deism".

Moral implying that God wants us to be nice. He rewards the good and withholds from the naughty.

Therapeutic meaning that God just wants us to be happy.

Deism meaning that God is distant and not involved in our daily lives. God may get involved occasionally, but on the whole, God functions like an idea not a personal being actively present in our world.

According to Smith, this is the version of God that's prevalent in our culture and in our churches. But we can't grow in our relationship with God when we insist on relating to God as we think he should be.

A.W. Tozer wrote, "Were we able to extract from any man a complete answer the question, "What comes into your mind when you think about God?' we might predict with certainty the spiritual future of that man... Without a doubt the mightiest thought the mind can entertain is the thought of God."

In another place Tozer wrote, "To be right, we must think worthily of God. It is morally imperative that we purge from our minds all ignoble concepts of the Deity and let Him be the God in our minds that He is in His universe."

In other words, the best thing we do, as Christ-followers is to encounter God and re-discover God-as-he-is, God as revealed in the Bible. We need to seek His face.

This August, each Sunday morning we are going to attempt to do just that—we are going to seek the face of God. We are going to look in Scripture to focus, not primarily on our needs, but on God's nature. We are going to think worthily about God, who He is—His majesty, holiness, sufficiency and goodness.

During the Israelites stay at Mt. Sinai, there was one Israelite who from personal experience knew about God's radiant face—Moses. Whenever Moses met with God he would emerge from that divine encounter with the divine glory reflected on his own face.

That is what happens after encountering God. You return changed.
