What is in a Name? BY JOEL SUTTON

Choosing a baby's name is can be In these four names God gave us insight stressful! Most of us have been as to Christ's identity. He provides involved in that process at some time in our lives. And we want to choose the perfect name.

I remember when Becky and I were trying to figure out what we would name our daughter. We went to a Barnes and Nobles bookstore and found a couple of books filled with names. I started at the end of the alphabet, with the 'Z' names. Becky started at the beginning, with the 'A' names and we met somewhere in the middle.

Names are significant. They connect memories and hope, promise and power, past and future. Choosing a name is a major step in shaping a child's identity. Choosing a name is the beginning of charting a child's future.

In the Old Testament world, a name was not merely a label, but it would often times describe the person who carried it. In I Samuel 25:25 Abigail says to David, "May my lord pay no attention to that wicked man Nabal. He is just like his name - his name is Fool and folly goes with him." (Emphasis is mine)

Choosing a name is serious business.

God through the prophet Isaiah chose four names for his son: Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace (Is. 9:6). These names were full of power and promise. They provided great hope for those who were going through the dark days of Isaiah's time.

answers. His son will be victorious. He will be personal and intimate. And he will provide peace.

This Christmas, who do you know that needs to know the hope of these four names? They are as significant now as they were when Isaiah gave them. Invite someone to join you on Sunday mornings during this season, someone who needs to hear the message of a Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, and Prince of Peace.



New in the Sanctuary



The newest additions to the sanctuary are these painted reproductions of the stained glass windows that are above the entry door facing Chicago Avenue. Originally the windows were located in the wall behind the altar in the sanctuary, but were moved to make room for the pipe organ pipes. The original windows were a gift of Mr. & Mrs. Albin E. Anderson.

The three lancets depict the Word, The Trinity, and Eternity. In the lancet on the left, has been placed the open Bible, the source of all revelation. In the center lancet are the symbols of the Trinity. The top symbol is the universal sign of God, the hand. No man hath seen God. Even Moses was permitted to behold just a part of God's revelation of Himself. The hand speaks of God's creative power, loving discipline, bountiful benevolence, and wise guidance. In the middle are the letters Chi Rho (X-R). These are the first two letters of the Greek name, Christ. This symbol appears on the earliest known Christian coins. It is also supposed to have been the sign seen by Constantine. Below these letters is the dove, the well-known symbol of the Holy Spirit. The lancet on the right, speaks of eternity. The crown of life is a reminder that those in whose memory the windows are presented and the many others who have gone on to their reward were not crowned with death—but with life.
