Families and children around the world have grown to love a special retelling of the biblical story line from *The Jesus Storybook Bible* written by Sally Lloyd-Jones. In her introduction to the big story of the Bible, Jones writes:

"There are lots of stories in the Bible, but all the stories are telling one Big Story. The Story of how God loves his children and comes to rescue them. It takes the whole Bible to tell this Story. And at the center of the Story there is a baby. Every story in the Bible whispers his name. He is like the missing piece in a puzzle—the piece that makes all the other pieces fit together, and suddenly, you can see a beautiful picture."

God's plan, from the very beginning was to glorify himself in the salvation of the human race. And the center of that plan, the missing puzzle piece throughout the Old Testament, was his Son, Jesus Christ, born on Christmas morning.

So who is Jesus?

Philip Yancey in his book, *The Jesus I Never Knew* relates a story about how Richard Nixon, back in 1969 got carried

away with excitement when the Apollo astronauts first landed on the moon. "It is the greatest day since Creation!" crowed the president, until Billy Graham corrected him by reminding him of Christmas and Easter.

We all need to be reminded about who Jesus is? In his first two years of His ministry Jesus taught the disciples who He was. In Mark 8:27 Jesus asked them, "Who do people say I am?" They gave the responses of the crowds, "John the Baptist...Elijah...one of the prophets". Jesus then asks, "Who do you say I am?" And Peter responds, "You are the Christ."

Richard Baxter wrote, "The heart of the gospel is to know God." The problem is that so many times our picture of God is warped. It is inaccurate. It is wrong.

And when our concept of who Christ is and what He has done for us is wrong, our response to Him is also mistaken. It is very difficult to yield your life to someone who you do not know properly!

As we come into this Christmas season, we need to be reminded who Jesus is. There are many names for Christ in Scripture. In fact, according to *Cruden's*

Concordance, there are 198 different names and titles of Jesus in the Bible. So during this Advent season we are going to look at five of them: the Word, Chief Cornerstone, Our Bridegroom, the Morning Star, and the Lamb of God. Each of these names carries with it a significant meaning; a unique understanding of who Christ—the one whose birth we celebrate on Christmas morning—really is.

This Christmas season, I invite you to join us, not only to celebrate, but to get to know Christ all over again. As the Apostle Paul says, "God...gave him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow in heaven and on earth and under the earth and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord to the glory of God, the Father." Philippians 2:9-11.

Loving Our Meighbors

In Matthew 22:36-40 we are given a glimpse into God's priorities, when Jesus is asked a blunt question:

"Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?"

Jesus replied: "'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments."

So then, what does it mean to love your neighbor?



Our property at 5151 Chicago will soon be home to a family from Afghanistan.

Jesus is asked this in Luke 10, and responds with the famous parable of the Good Samaritan. In the conclusion of that one, Jesus asks a question of His own:

"Which of these three do you think was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?" The expert in the law replied, "The one who had mercy on him." Jesus told him, "Go and do likewise."

So our instructions are clear: God wants us to love our neighbors, and He is clear about who our neighbors are and what loving them looks like. And he says the only commandment more important than that is loving God Himself.

Wow. We should probably take that one pretty seriously then.

One of the ways we are doing that at First Free is through our support of Arrive Ministries. This is a Christian nonprofit that assists refugees with resettlement in America—specifically here in Minnesota. Quite literally, to show the love of Christ to our new neighbors. We've been financial supporters of Arrive for many years, and in recent years we've been more involved tangibly as well, providing housing in two properties we own at a discounted rate, and forming a Good Neighbor team to walk alongside these families during their first year in Minneapolis.

In the past several weeks, that team has been preparing to welcome a new family from Afghanistan. People from all across First Free have reached out and offered items to this family—from bedding to furniture to clothes to toys to TVs. The response has been remarkable. We are excited to welcome these new neighbors and love them as ourselves—and as we do so, to reflect the love of Jesus.
