# Irreducible Majesty BY JAY POUND

At the heart of the advent season is a profound tension. Every year at Advent, we celebrate the miracle of the incarnation, when the God of all creation took on flesh, when somehow in Jesus the full majesty of God took up residence in a fully human being. Somehow, Jesus was fully both at once - not half man and half God (like Heracles or Perseeus), but fully God and fully man. This is a core tenet of the faith, a truth foundational to the plan of salvation, a glorious miracle, and also a deep and sacred mystery.

The longer I have walked with the Lord, the more comfortable I have become with this tension and others like it. And there are many. Christianity is a faith full of these tensions. Our God is three persons, but only one God. Our God is transcendent, holy, far above and separate from creation, and yet he is also the God who initiates, who seeks and saves, who woos his wayward children with love and mercy. Our God is just, but he is not impartial. Our savior is fully God, and yet fully human.

When I was younger, I found all of this vaguely uncomfortable. I thought the truth should be simpler and more straightforward. I felt the temptation, present from the beginning of the faith, to collapse these complicated tensions in one direction or the other. I wanted to simplify and streamline these messy claims. And I discovered that throughout Christian history, far better minds than mine had already applied themselves to the work. Some argued that the God of the Old Testament was a different God than the one revealed in Jesus. Some argued that Jesus only appeared to be human. Some argued that Jesus never really claimed to be divine. But all of these aesthetic "improvements" eventually ran aground on the shores of scripture, which stubbornly refused to be reduced to less than what it is.

I am not sure what changed inside of me; I like to think I have matured, at least a little. Whatever the reason, I began to see these tensions very differently. Now I wonder if what looks like theological sloppiness from our end

is in reality the only possible way to make an infinite God even remotely comprehensible to finite minds. Today, I am inclined to think that these tensions are exactly what you would expect when our limited mortal minds try to make sense of a God for whom nothing is impossible. Perhaps these tensions are the best we can do when we, mere creatures, try to come to terms with the plans of an all knowing, all wise God. Maybe human minds cannot make sense of the incarnation, not really, not fully—not yet, maybe we can only behold it and worship.

In our sermon series this advent we will be focusing specifically on the significance and implications of the incarnation. Each week we will use a passage from the book of Hebrews to explore one of these great truths. And we will explore the incarnation, this great and central tension, not to flatten or disentangle it, but simply to understand it a little better. And also, so that we might once more fix our eyes on the irreducible majesty of our God - and worship!
