Becoming Apprentices of Jesus by Paul Anleitner

Over the course of my life, I've consumed a considerable amount of Star Wars content. My sense of wonder with the fictitious universe began as a boy when I walked into my neighborhood friend's house where he was watching the final act of *Return of the Jedi*. From that point on, I was all in. Expanded universe novels, comic books, and even official encyclopedias—I've consumed them all. Admittedly, my love for Star Wars has waned in recent years and I may no longer be able to dominate a hardcore game of Star Wars trivia, but feel free to test my nerdy knowledge at any time.

Sadly, I must report to you that despite all of the books, movies, and TV series I've absorbed over the course of my life, I am no closer to being a Jedi Knight than I was as a young boy. Every effort to use the "Force" and telekinetically pull the television remote into my grasp when it was out of reach, and I was too lazy to get up and grab it, has failed. The inability for my consumption of facts to change who I am isn't just relegated to Star Wars either. My consumption of ancient history information has never turned me into a Spartan warrior. My love for all things Batman-related has not turned me into a billionaire vigilante. Most sadly of all, I have found consuming endless amounts of information about Jesus has not automatically made me more Christ-like.

Obviously, I jest about hoping to become a Jedi Knight or the Dark Knight, but I do that to illustrate a deeper point. That has its place, but the kind of discipleship they undertook was much more like a modern trades apprenticeship where a young plumber follows a master plumber and simply does everything the master does.

While we are in a sermon series on the Gospel of Matthew to start this calendar year, our goal is not to merely consume information about Jesus, but to allow the story of Jesus in the sacred Scriptures to call us to practicing The Way of Jesus. Don't get me wrong—if someone says to us, "Jesus is like this," we want to be able to identify if they are right or wrong. But what we are after is not to win Bible trivia contests. We are after the transformation of our character into Christ-like conformity.

So, this year we will be stretching and growing as a community in how to be apprentices of Jesus, practicing the disciplines of Christ-like formation, and learning how to live in The Way.
