



# Whose Fries are These? BY Joel Sutton

Imagine with a father, let's call him Fred wanted to do something special with his five year old son Jimmy. So he asked "Son, is there anything you'd like to do right now?" Jimmy said, "I want some McDonald French Fries."

So they got into the dad's blue and white chevy truck went to the nearest McDonald's and Fred ordered and paid for some fries for his son. And not just the smallest size, but he "super-sized" his order.

Even before they sat down, Jimmy's little teeth were ready to sink into this huge blessing of hot golden fries. Fred was happy to see his little boy so happy over something so simple. As they sat and talked. Fred decided to join in the fun. He reached over to grab a couple of Jimmy's fries for himself.

But to his surprise, his son quickly put his arms around his fries as though he was building a fort and pulled them toward himself and said to his father, "No, these are mine." His dad was in a momentary state of shock. He could not believe what had just happened.

Fred pulled back his hand and began to think about his son's attitude toward those fries. "I was the source of those fries for my son," Fred thought. "After all, I paid for them. And not only did I pay for them but I bought him the "supersized" fries. Yet here is my son talking about his French fries. Doesn't Jimmy know that if I wanted I could take them from or I could go back to the counter

ever eat."

As the dad thought more about it, he also realized that one or two fries really would not have made much of a difference for him that day. What he really wanted was for his son Jimmy, to invite him into the wonderful little world that he had made possible for his son. He wanted his son to be willing to share the very blessing that he had provided.

In similar way, God has blessed each of us. He has blessed you and God has blessed me. He's given us all some French fries. Some of us have a small bag of fries, some a medium size, others a large and some your fries have been super-sized. But God has given us all some fries.

And like that dad. God desires to sit down at the table with us for some fellowship. But far too often, when God reaches over to use some of the blessings he has given to us, our response is, "No God, these are mine. Go and get your own."

In King David's prayer in 1 Chronicles 29, we are given three important truths about God's blessings. First, we are reminded that everything belongs to God. "For everything in heaven and earth is yours." (1 Chron. 29:11). All those fries we enjoy in reality belong to God.

Second, everything comes from God. "Wealth and honor come from you" (1 Chron. 29:12). All my wealth, all my gold and silver, all my cars and houses, all my

and buy more fries than Jimmy could investments and all my savings accounts - it all comes from God. All my honor, all my awards, all those certificates that I am tempted to hang on my office walls, all I have, it all, ultimately comes from

> Third, everything is distributed to us by God. Continuing on, vs. 12, David prays, "You (God) are the ruler of all things. In your hands are strength and power to exalt and give strength to all." The little word "exalt" there means "to make great". In other words, God, all I have and all that I am it all has been given to me by you.

God, if I have accomplished anything in life, it is because you have allowed me to do it. If I have bubbled up to the surface in my profession or in my company, you have provided me the opportunity. If I have been recognized because of a talent or skill I have, all those skills and talents have come from you, God.

This month of February we are going to be talking about what the Bible says about generosity and money in a series titled. "Living with the Benjamins". I pray that as we tackle this very practical and significant topic, we might learn again these three lessons: Everything belongs to God. Everything comes from God. Everything is distributed by God. And so our response to God when he reaches over to use some of those blessings he has given to us is simply, "God help yourself. I want to honor you with everything I have."
