Starting January 19th, we will be hosting Financial Peace University, a class designed to help you get out of debt, save for the future, and spend wisely. Regardless of your income level, this class will give you strategies to move toward financial stability and good stewardship of God's gifts. Here are some answers to frequently asked questions.

How do I sign up for the course and when are the • classes?

It will bring you to the First Free registration page on the Dave Ramsey website. Classes start January 19th from 6:30 - 8:15pm and will end March 16th. Childcare will be provided.

How do I get materials?

How much does it cost?

process. It is exhaling the impure and inhaling the pure. It works like this: When you become aware of sin in your life, you deal with it at that very moment, wherever you are. You say, "Lord, I agree with you that what I have done is sin. Forgive me." That is exhaling. Then you say, "Lord, I want you to be in control of my life once again. Fill me again with your Holy Spirit." That is inhaling. As you practice this spiritual breathing, exhaling and then inhaling, you will discover that you can live the whole day in the power of the Holy Spirit.

The Christian life can only be lived with "Christ in us" through the power of the Holy Spirit. Look at these verses (emphasis mine):

Zechariah 4:6: "Not by might nor by power, but by my Spirit."

Philippians 4:13: "I can do all things through Him who strengthens me."

Galatians 2:20: "I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who lives but Christ who lives within me."

One of our marks of a Christcentered, Christ-sent person is that they live Holy Spirit-dependent lives. As we begin this new year, we are going to be looking at the Holy Spirit, who He is and what He does, on Sunday mornings. All of us desperately need the Holy Spirit to empower us to be what God intended us to be. Otherwise our lives just remain one large scribbled mess!
