Marriage: God's Great Idea by pastor joel sutton

Marriage was God's great idea. Therefore, marriage is to be celebrated. When God fashioned Eve and brought her to Adam, they celebrated (Gen. 2:22-25). When Ruth and Boaz were united, there was jubilation (Ruth 4:14). In Song of Songs, we find a love poem between a bride, the Beloved and a bridegroom, the Lover, as they rejoice in their love and relationship.

Proverbs 5:18 says: "May your fountain be blessed, and may you rejoice in the wife of your youth." "Rejoice" means to reel as though intoxicated. No doubt about it! God's talking about celebration!

Rejoicing in your "coupleness"—celebrating your oneness—(beyond the wedding day) is an action that demands choices. If the Holy Spirit lives inside you, you have the power to turn your marriage into jubilation.

How do you do that? Let me suggest three actions you can start with in order celebrate in your marriage.

Keep Accounts Short

The psalmist, "Search me, O God, and know my heart... see if there is any offensive way in me" (Psalm 139:23-24). That is a good practice for all of us to do – whether married or not. But in marriage it is especially important to keep your consciences clear before each other. If you have hurt the other person, then humbly seek your mates forgiveness. In other word, keep short accounts with each other.

Since God is the One we are to imitate in the way we forgive, we need to understand how He forgives us. God does not withhold forgiveness. On the contrary, He forgives completely, with no remembrance of our sin. He says He hurls all our iniquities into the depths of the sea (Micah 7:19). He never brings them back up to hold over our heads.

Seek forgiveness from each other quickly and regularly. Keep accounts short with one another and with God.

Give Honor To Your Mate

Husbands, be sensitive to your wife's needs. Ask what she needs; then listen carefully. Pay attention to her when she talks with you. Accept her feelings. You may not understand them, but you must respect them as real and viable.

Wives, magnify your husband's strengths, not his weaknesses. Do not review past failures, and love your husband for who and what he is right now. Celebrate your relationship by giving honor to one another and by giving honor to your marriage. God wants you to see your husband through the eyes of Jesus, with all the potential He sees.

Live in God's Presence

The key to fellowship with your mate is for both of you to live in God's presence. When you and your wife are both committed to Christ and what He's doing in the world, you'll

be naturally drawn together. Spiritual unity enhances romance.

God wants you to have oneness. Romance was God's idea. The Bible says two shall become one - intellectually, emotionally, physically, recreationally, and spiritually. When you are only having oneness in three of those areas, your marriage isn't fully what God wants it to be. But when you and your spouse connect in all five areas, that's when you find real, honest oneness.

Do you and your spouse pray together? Do you do ministry together? Do you share what God is doing in your life with your spouse, and vis-versa? Make those things a part of your time together, and you will celebrate together!

This month of May we are preaching a four week series on love, relational intimacy and marriage from the Old Testament wisdom book, Song of Songs. In a world like ours, where the disintegration and devaluing of marriage has left many wondering whether lifelong vows are worth the commitment and what true love is supposed to look like, it is good for us to look for God's wisdom and get God's perspective on this important topic. After all, marriage was God's great idea. §

Velocity Student Ministry had a great time in Duluth for District Blitz Youth Conference! 39 students and 10 leaders went up and participated in general sessions, large and small youth group breakout sessions, and topic based workshops. The theme for the weekend was *Romans: Road to Salvation*. Speakers focused on the blessed process of salvation on that road which includes a clear understanding of how desperate our need is for being saved from our sinful fallen state. They then honed in on the saving power of the shed blood of Jesus Christ to bring us back into fellowship with our Creator and Father. Additionally, there was free time for fellowship, connection, and checking out the fair city of Duluth.
