

He Knows Not How BY JOEL SUTTON

There is a beautiful area in northern California known as the wine country. Immaculately groomed vineyards stretch on for miles and grows in startling symmetry. Yet each vineyard grows its own particular varieties of grapes according to its own specific standards. The processing facilities also differ some using the old world process and others a high tech operation.

But all of them rely upon one indispensable factor. They each are dependent upon the right type of climate for the growing of their grapes. Good grapes are produced when good vines are planted in good soil and then nurtured in the right environment.

Jesus tells us the same thing, when he says, "The kingdom of God is as if a man should scatter seed on the ground. He sleeps and rises night and day, and the seed sprouts and grows; he knows not how. The earth produces by itself, first the blade, then the ear, then the full grain in

When it comes to the kingdom of God there are some things that people can do and some things people cannot do. I love that phrase, "he knows not how." As God's people we should sow and harvest, but we cannot produce the fruit. We can sleep and rise, but we cannot make the harvest happen. The harvest happens, but we know not how. It is the "all by itself" principle.

Christians do not automatically grow up in Christ. They need to be in an environment that encourages and nurtures growth. Although we plan and strategize, we recognize that growth - both spiritually and numerically - is God's domain.

Therefore, at First Free our concentration is on the environment. We focus on the quality: inspiring worship, Biblical and engaging

teaching, authentic community, and outward-facing service. We focus on praying together and loving each person who comes through our doors. We seek to eliminate obstacles to spiritual growth by developing effective ministries for children, youth and their families.

Our mission at First Free is to help individuals become Christ-centered and Christ-sent together. This past year, as a church, we have specifically concentrated on the second half of Jesus' greatest commandment, loving your neighbor. One hundred and fifty-seven people took the High Five challenge, to love five specific neighbors. In the foyer of the church, we have our "High Five" prayer list. That means we are loving on, serving and praying for over 785 neighbors. Can you imagine the harvest God is going to produce?
