NEW SERMON SERIES & RECOMMENDED READING,

We've just finished our sermon series on the Gospel of Mark. Next, we'll study the <u>Book of Ruth</u> together and will call this series "*There is a Redeemer*".


The basic storyline follows a Jewish woman named Naomi, first as she travels to a foreign land with her family in search of a better life, and then back to her homeland after suffering enormous losses. In fact, when she returns home, she asks people to call her Mara, which means "bitter." Can the Lord provide for a bitter old lady? What roles do her daughter-in-law and

her relative, Boaz play in her life? Will God bring good to this poor widow? How does this story fit into God's plan of redemption? We will also examine the implications that this account of the lives of Ruth, Boaz, and Naomi have for the church today. I think we'll come to find that our God brings His blessing to His people even through the most difficult of situations and that Jesus is the ultimate kinsman-Redeemer.

Ruth consists of four chapters that we'll aim to cover in seven weeks during May and June. In addition, you might read some of what I will be reading in my sermon preparation process. To that end, I will be looking at Paul Miller's book, *A Loving Life* (he has another book called *A Praying Life* so if you purchase it for yourself, make sure to get the correct title).

About the book: "Best-selling author Paul Miller tackles these tough questions at the heart of our struggle to love head-on. Drawing from the book of Ruth, *A Loving Life* offers the help we need to embrace relationship, endure rejection, cultivate community, and reach out to even the most unlovable around us as we discover the power to live a loving life."

About the author: Paul E. Miller (MDiv, Biblical Seminary) is the executive director of *seeJesus* as well as the best-selling author of several books. With the help of his ministry staff, Miller creates and conducts interactive discipleship seminars throughout the world. He and his wife, Jill, live in the Philadelphia area and have six children as well as a growing number of grandchildren.
