# NO SHORTCUTS

I love crepe myrtle trees. Like the ones that line the sidewalk in front of the Joy Center, many crepe myrtles that have been well-pruned and maintained can grow into gorgeous trees. The abundant canopy of flowers that emerge at the beginning of summer are one of the indelible images of the South.

We have some neighbors who regularly commit what we jokingly refer to in our house as "crepe murder." About this time of year, they cut every branch off the tree and leave a spindly tree about five feet tall. The reason for this makes sense. When the tree is sheared off at so many places, it forces rapid growth from every exposed cut. Over the course of the spring, numerous shoots of new growth emerge from the cut off branches producing a huge number of blooms and flowers come the first of summer. It produces quick fruit and flowers, but the growth is a false sign of maturity.

At the beginning of the year, I read a book called Everyday Supernatural about growing into a deeper sense of life in God, becoming more aware of the Spirit of God, and participating in God's powerful movement. I was enamored by the stories of people who were so attuned to the Spirit. It seemed they heard God in crystal clear ways, had experiences of powerful prayer, or hearing a word from God in astounding ways. I began to pray that God would give me these types of experiences in my life. I wanted to know him in these powerful ways. It was as I was praying about this desire that God reminded me of the crepe myrtles. In our relationship with God, we can try and shortcut the growth process, too. We can do all kinds of things to try and force fruit and flower on our time and to match our desires, and while that behavior might make for more blooms on the crepe myrtle in your yard, God wants us to be mature trees. He isn't interested in fast fruit; God wants the roots to grow deep. In our relationship with God, the way we get an increasing amount of fruit and flowers is by growing to maturity. It is by letting the roots go deep and letting God prune and grow us according to his desires.

Psalm 1 says the genuinely happy person is the person who "loves the Lord's instruction" and "recites God's instruction day and night" (v. 2). "They are like a tree replanted by streams of water, which bears fruit at just the right time and whose leaves don't fade" (v. 3). In John 15, Jesus said you can't produce fruit "unless you remain in me" (v. 4).

Where do you attempt to shortcut the growing process? Where do you try to get the fruit and the flower without letting the roots grow deep or without letting God prune you? What might God long to do in you, what type of harvest might he want to bring, when you seek growth and roots growing deep in him? As we continue our Lenten journey, how might you join God in growing deep roots. The fruit and flower that come with deep roots will surpass whatever you might force today.



# **REAL LIFE NEEDS: SALLY RECOVERY**

When flying back from doing mission work in Costa Rica, Charlie Moore of New Hampshire, flew over areas hard hit from Hurricane Katrina. It was at that time God put it in his heart to help those who had lost everything from natural disasters. He created Team Acts 20:35 and he has since worked with thousands of volunteers, young and old, from across the country. He has seen God move in miraculous ways by bringing hope and restoration to families of disasters, and to the volunteers. Charlie states that "ACTS 20:35 was created by the Love of our God to be a conduit to bring together His people in communion together to show the Love of Christ to a hurting world".

In the last week of February, Charlie and his team came to Foley UMC to help repair and rebuild our community. You may have seen some of the team members on our campus. Our KidsQuest kids have been decorating prayer boxes for the team to give to each of the families they are able to help. At our 11:00 service, our church congregation was able to pray over the team as they got ready to go out into the community.

Along with Team Acts 20:35, Just The Crumbs Ministries came to our church to feed the Team members while they were here. Beth Burkes, a retired school teacher from Sumrall, Mississippi, created the ministry to provide help to the helpless, hope to the hopeless, love to the unloved, food to the hungry, clothes to the needy, and the love of Christ to all! The Just the Crumbs Ministry was established as a non-profit Ministry in February of 2015. Since that time, they have responded to over 23 natural disasters across the United States. They have provided over 500,000 hot meals to those in need, and those volunteering to serve those in need. They have been able to help build homes in Mississippi and Texas. They have also supplied sheetrock for over 220 homes and 3 churches, and an additional \$500,000 in building supplies. Most

importantly they have spread the Gospel and seen many people come to Christ along the way. They came to our church directly after spending two weeks in Fultondale, AL feeding first responders and city officials who worked long hours with no days off taking care of their city.

Watch for updates next month on the relationships that were established, homes repaired, and hearts healed while these teams worked in our area. We are excited about partnering with these organizations.

Other ministry occurs regularly as a result of your generosity. Recently a family contacted our church for help. Carmen (not her real name) and her 2 teenage girls were forced to leave a bad situation in Florida to move to the Foley area. They had very little furniture, very little food, and very little clothing. We sent out a text to the church's Sally Volunteer group for help.\* Within 24 hours, our church family had filled their pantry, provided clothing, shoes, lamps, rugs, and given them a dining room table to gather at to eat their meals. We received so much food that we were able to deliver a huge box of extra food to Ecumenical Ministries to share with other families in need and a large box of snacks to Florence Mathis Elementary School. The family was so appreciative and so amazed at the generosity of a church family who did not hesitate even one second to help strangers in need. Please keep these teams and families in your prayers.

### **HOW ARE YOU LIVING A LIFE OF SERVICE?**

As we have been working our way through the book of Philippians in church, I wonder how you might find yourself being challenged. As we have been learning, this was a letter to the church in Philippi that Paul wrote while he was in jail. He took this opportunity to stress the importance of living out the life of Christ in our own lives. He was telling the church in Philippi that there was no better way to be Jesus to the opposition around them than to become servants even to the point of death, just like Jesus. That begs the question, how are you living a life of service? Maybe you don't even know where to begin to live a life of service. What does service look like? How do you start to become a servant? Service is really about loving those God has put in your life. The first place to start looking for people to serve is in the people in your life. Are there people that you could check in on? Are there people that you could build a relationship where there isn't one? Are there people that you see on a regular basis that you could be intentional about serving and making them more important than yourself? Living a life that reflects a life that Jesus would live if he was living your life requires loving people in your life like Jesus loves them. It means being ready to give up your life for them, and choosing to put them first. In real life terms, it means reminding ourselves to stop thinking we are the only people that matter and that we have all the right answers and everyone else is wrong. The very act of choosing not to argue with someone about how wrong they are, but rather to understand them and where they came from, is a step in the right direction. This might sound like a very big

step for some of you, but there is good news. You are not alone, and you don't have to start in the hardest places. There is one place that we can start practicing how to be servants together. We are planning on being able to start gathering again as a church in the fall. Based on what we are hearing from people who study these things, we might be able to start gathering again in September. I wonder what it will look like if we come back with some new goals as a church. What if one of those goals is to be the best servants in Foley, AL. One of the things we want to start preparing for is being ready to serve everyone who steps foot in our doors. This includes greeting people at the doors, having well trained ushers, trained sound and video workers, and having people serving coffee and smiling. I invite you to become a part of one of these teams. Church is the best place to start practicing on how to serve others. Our church family has been brought together by God and we are called to serve each other as well as our community. If you are breathing and able to read this letter then there is a place for you to serve others at Foley UMC. If all vou can do is sit in a chair at the front door and smile at people as they come into church then you are perfectly made for serving others. Serving in the church is the perfect place to start making servanthood a permanent practice in your life. What you will find is that as you serve at the church; serving will spread into all areas of your life.



# A KEEPSAKE FROM THE PRESENCE OF GOD

#### KIDS CONNECTION



It is now time for the lipstick and rouge.

There are four areas on the north side of the Spirit Center that are being worked on to channel water from the new downspouts away from the building into the parking lot. I am planning to remove all vegetation from those areas and inviting Classes and Life Groups to sponsor an area. A suggestion might be to regrade the areas and put in river rock or decorative rock. If you want greenery, please use big pots and tend them. In the corner by The Well, I have removed the Myrtle that was a future problem to the roof. In that grassy area, I am thinking of putting a couple of picnic tables. I would like some input on whether or not to keep the bushes, add pavers under the table, etc. This area is also up for sponsorship. If you have an idea for an area, we can certainly talk.
