

"I will not cause pain without allowing something new to be born," says the LORD.

Isaiah 66:9 (NCV)

A few weeks ago, as I stood in front of you, waiting for the countdown to tell me we were live on livestream, I was struck with amazement at what I was seeing – a thriving, robust body of Christ that has assembled for eight months now without a senior pastor. In those eight months, my spiritual journey has been intense. From the first moments of shock and grief, our loving heavenly Father has used this time to help me grow and mature. And through this growth, I hope to help and encourage you. I want to share the blessings God has granted us, beginning with Bob being installed as our pastor to now, when we are seeking God's discernment for our next pastor.

First, God sent us Bob, knowing we'd only have him for less than a handful of years. In a fully human sense, I cry out, "That's not fair! You took him from us too soon. We had so much more to learn from him!" Turning that around, we see the blessing of having Bob lead us through the pandemic, a daunting job, and one he did well.

And how did he do it well? From day one, he taught and reminded us that he was not the head of the church. We are *all* the body of the church, worshipping and serving our Lord Jesus Christ, the only head of the church. For four years God used him to equip us to do what we are doing. Though it dumbfounded us, God was not surprised to welcome Bob into his arms. And he equipped Bob to prepare us for just such a situation.

Do you know how deeply disrupted FPC was upon his death?



We skipped one week of midweek announcements.

Let that sink in for a moment. It was minutes before we were supposed to film on a Thursday morning that we got the news. Had it come a day earlier, we would have continued on without interruption. That's it. One less Mary and Sherri Show. There was immediate scrambling, phone calls, emergency meetings, visiting pastoral care. But on Sunday we were at church, being ministered to by one of nine visiting pastors who have now shared a word with us. But here's another blessing that we've been given: As of October 29th, we've had fourteen people within our own congregation take a Sunday to preach, teach, and testify. This is the fruit of what Bob planted in us during his time here.

But we haven't just maintained, waiting patiently for new leadership to keep us on track. Recently, we held a New Covenant Partners Class, and welcomed *three* people into our congregation. Adult Sunday School has continued. The monthly newsletter has gone out. Committees have met and planned, organized, budgeted, and led. Musicians have learned new pieces and played and sang to the Lord. We've enjoyed larger gatherings such as the Ice Cream Social, Deacon Sunday, and the Autumn Alliteration Adventure. I can't help but think that to the outside world, their vision of us is that we should be in turmoil and chaos. However - We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose.

The blessings don't stop there, by any means. The first round of interviews has now taken place. Multiple pastors responded to FPC's need for a senior pastor. I believe each one prayed about the decision to apply for this position and sought God's calling in this move. I know our Pastor Search Team has prayed for months for wisdom and discernment in revealing this person to us.

Now, imagine for a moment you're one of those people. You are able to go online, and thanks to our livestream and YouTube channel, familiarize yourself with our church. You'd do it, wouldn't you? And what would you find? A thriving, robust body of Christ that has prayerfully sought to follow God's will and continue the ministries of FPC through one of its most difficult seasons. You would be eager to serve among such a congregation. I do hope and believe that this is the case, and we can look forward to what God has in store for us as we move into the next stage in the life of our church. Take the time to ponder for yourself the blessings you've seen during 2023, thank God for all he has done and continues to do, and pray for our new pastor, who will surely be blessed by the body of Christ at FPC.

Candi & Wil Euler coordinate this fun activity so if you have questions, see one of them.




DON'T FORGET! Daylight Saving Time ENDS on November 5

Music for the Seasons

Before we celebrate the Advent season, November is the end of the Liturgical Year and gives us an opportunity to give thanks for the author of salvation and the one who has given us the gift of the church, the fellowship of the body that we celebrate each time we gather in person. Thanksgiving Day is a chance to ask God for forgiveness for our sins, repent for our disobedience, and express gratitude for all He has given us. Thanksgiving is a time to celebrate the abundance of God. Therefore, we will be singing songs and hymns of praise and thanks.

Now that fall has finally arrived, the choir is starting to prepare for the Advent and Christmas season as well. The Christmas Cantata is being rehearsed along with other anthems to be sung throughout this season. The Cantata is open to anyone to join the choir and be a part of the Cantata performance. As part of our outreach as a music ministry, the Cantata, "Let There Be Christmas," will be performed by our First



Presbyterian Church Chancel Choir, along with people outside of our congregation from our community, and other churches will be represented. Within the Cantata the congregation will be singing along with the choir, making this a heartfelt performance and celebration. The Cantata will be performed on Sunday, December 17th during the Sunday church service.

Our bell choir, Grace Notes, started rehearsals in August and is now preparing to perform for worship services October through May. The bell choir performs musical pieces that have been arranged by our bell choir conductor, Paul Weaver. These arrangements have been written to help modify the number of ringers that are in the bell choir, along with enhancing the musical arrangements to embellish the bell choir's sound. The bell choir will be performing once a month from now up through the Advent season. The next arrangements will be performed on November 12th and December 10th.

The Praise Team will be doing special songs this Advent season to help enrich our upcoming holiday season. Along with the Praise Team there will be special music performed by guest cellist Lou Goffman and pianist Lynda Norris on December 3rd during the worship service. The piece they will be performing is called "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel." On December 10th during the Offertory, a harp and clarinet duet will be performing an arrangement of "What Child Is This?" The instrumentalists performing this piece are harpist, Mary Law, and clarinetist, Carol Yeager Deode.

During the Advent Season, the congregation will be singing traditional Christmas carols to help celebrate this joyous time of year and get everyone into the holiday spirit! This year's Advent season will be a wonderful time of year and celebration leading us up to the birth of our savior, Jesus Christ.

...THROUGH FOOD DONATIONS

The Northern Nevada Dream Center (NNDC) Food Bags will be available on Sunday, November 12th for you to share holiday food for upcoming Christmas celebrations. Every year we fill Christmas bags for the NNDC to deliver to individuals or families in our local communities who do not have the means of getting food for their Christmas celebrations. You help bring joy to them by providing a bag full of non-perishable food items and \$20 with which the NNDC purchases a ham or turkey to complete their meal.



Christmas bags will be available at the church mid-November in the Narthex and at the office, or contact Charlene Rodman to have a bag to fill delivered to you. There is a list of food items that you will purchase and an envelope for the \$20 (cash or check) for the NNDC to purchase the ham or turkey. If you wish to write a check, please make it out to the Northern Nevada Dream Center (NOT the church). If you would like to attach a Christmas card or special item like Christmas candies, it is always welcomed! The purpose of these bags is to bring joy to these families and share The Good News of Jesus Christ—the real reason for the season! Bags will be due back to the church no later than **December 3**.



...THROUGH ANGEL TREE

Every year our church partners with Prison Ministry to purchase Christmas gifts for children in the Carson City area whose parent is in prison. We need your participation when the names are made available at the table in the Narthex on October 23 through November 12th.

Gifts should be returned by November 26th.

Volunteers call the caretaker for each family to determine what the child needs or wants as a clothing and toy gift. We then prepare Angel Tags for each boy and girl in the families we received. These tags show what you should buy for the child: size needed, their age, and sex. Toys and clothing are two separate gift opportunities. Gifts should be new and cost no more than \$25 each.

You attach the Angel Tag to the gift when you return it so we know to whom it is to be delivered. A gift receipt can be included in case it needs to be returned. Volunteers call the caretakers again to arrange a day when they can come in to pick up their gifts the week of December 10. We meet them in the Narthex and give them their gifts and pamphlets about Jesus. Cards to order free age-appropriate Bibles are provided, so they can fill them out and mail to Prison Ministry. We don't have any Bibles to give out this year.

OLD SANCTUARY PRESERVATION UPDATE

Since the formation of the Old Sanctuary Steering Committee, we have raised close to \$140,000 toward the preservation of the Old Sanctuary. Expenditures to-date are approximately \$43,000: we have replaced the roof, replaced two sets of stairs at the entrances on Nevada Street, powder coated and replaced both sets of railings for the stairs, and hired Construction Engineer Melvyn Green to evaluate needed work by phase. A portion of the funds raised have been from fundraisers, but the majority of the funds is from the generous donations from YOU. Without your help, the preservation of the Old Sanctuary would not be possible.

Thank you so very much.

Our next major project, as determined by Mr. Green, is to clean the paint and regrout the tower of the Old Sanctuary. We have this project tentatively scheduled for Spring 2024 with Abstract Masonry Restoration of Salt Lake City, Utah. The estimate is \$119,000 for the regrouting with some additional for the extensive cleaning and treating of the paint residue from the bricks. We currently have close to \$100,000 in our accounts and are hoping to have additional funds from proceeds of the Fall Holiday Craft Fair and the Chili Cook-off to cover the entire project.
