From the Pastor's Desk

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

In the office you have given me, there are several items embossed or engraved with the answer to the first question of the Westminster Shorter Catechism. It is a theme you will hear me repeat – perhaps redundantly, over and over again – in sermons, classes, and conversation.

Question 1: What is the chief end of man?

Answer: Man's chief end is to glorify God and enjoy him forever.

Over the years I have found this to be helpful in finding calm in the center of storms. "Glorifying God" encompasses obedience and participation of both elements of the Great Command: loving God with all our heart, soul, mind and strength; and loving neighbor as self. We glorify God as we do those things.

Popular Christian culture picked up on this a few years ago with the bracelets that read, "WWJD" or what would Jesus do? When we look at Jesus' relationship with the Father, we see the pure version of glorifying God and enjoying God forever. Even Jesus' anguish in the Garden fits that description – including "enjoy." "Look to Jesus the pioneer and perfector

of our faith, who *for the sake of the joy* that was set before him endured the cross, *disregarding its shame*, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God." (Hebrews 12:2) Jesus endured and disregarded the shame of the cross in the hope and trust of the joy of God's presence. Jesus' unyielding commitment to obeying God's leading was the fullest expression of what it means glorifying God. In all times – solitude, small groups, and before the masses – Jesus' life brought glory and honor to God.

I would love to be able to tell you that I have followed Jesus' example at all the high and low points of my life. I have not. My awareness of the ways in which I have fallen short makes me immediately and profoundly grateful that God has given me the victory that Jesus has won. The assurance of God's grace picks me up after I have fallen and allows me the hope to try to glorify him going forward.

It is the second part of the answer that provides me tremendous encouragement. We are to enjoy God forever. God has not structured the walk of discipleship to be drudgery. It is not intended to be a perpetual obligation. God is not waiting for us to fail so that he can smite us with a lightning bolt. Yes, God wants us to have a clear and awesome view of who he is – that's the "fear" or wonder – but God also wants to envelope us in the love which will bless us beyond the ways we could imagine for ourselves. Our faith is the growing relationship with God in which we discover daily the delights of his great love for us.

Do you ever allow yourself to think about how God has created you to *enjoy* him? What would enjoying God mean to you?

It is the contemplating of enjoying God forever that puts all the trials and tribulations of today into perspective. I think of the times when I have felt closest to God, like mountaintop experiences or moments of connection with others. It takes some effort to dwell on those moments without immediately countering, "yes, but..."; however, when I do, I get really excited about who God is and what it will be like to spend eternity in

God's presence. I begin to resonate with Paul's comments to the Philippians, "Beloved, I do not consider that I have made it my own; but this one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus."

The prize of our faith is to be able to enjoy God forever. Thus, let us live to glorify God now and always. Your brother in Christ.



From Bruce's Workshop

"GRATITUDE"

We have just come through the season of Lent and Easter. This, coupled with a major change in all our lives leaves me reflecting on the power of gratitude. Gratitude comes when we take stock of what has happened and is happening in our lives from about 30,000 feet; that is, from the big picture.

When I am wise enough to do this, I find the first and most important thing I am grateful for is that God loves me and that I know it. I am grateful that I am not who I may have wanted to become, but I am becoming who Jesus died to make me. In this I am grateful, as Amy Grant has sung, "That all I ever have to be is who HE made me." I think in our



hurried approach to life we can so easily miss this on a daily basis. When we do I think we miss the greatest opportunity for evangelism. The reason I say this is because I see a world around us that is increasingly ungrateful because it restlessly wants more on the outside when what it needs is what God alone can do on the inside.

When I was a little boy of four or five we went somewhere and some grown-up said, "Wow! Wouldn't you like to have a car like *that*!" I blurted out, "No, we already have one at home." I remember a man said, "How do you like that? A kid who doesn't want everything." Listen, I have admitted to wanting lots of stuff plenty of times, but in that moment I am grateful that I knew that what mattered was something *I already had*! Our family car was one my dad had rescued from a fire. He restored it and we drove it for ten years; unheard of in those days.

I am grateful for knowing that God has rescued us and restored us and that what we need most we already have "at home". Because I know this I know I really don't need anything else. I am grateful for simple things; for remembering that I have always had everything that I need on every level. I am grateful that I never got things and visions that I was never meant to have. I am grateful that I am who I am because of Jesus Christ. THIS is what our world is longing to have even though they don't know it. It is so utterly simple. We want to be wanted and valued and no one does this better than God. That is what Easter is about; that God wants us and has given us the greatest sign of this.

I know at this season in life there are a lot of things I thought I knew, but I don't and that's OK. I am grateful for knowing that I am loved in ways that mysteriously take me beyond anything this world can offer; but never provide. I am deeply grateful that you are my friends and continually teach me about being grateful for the love that will not let us go.

Thank you my friends. May this spring bring us all a deep sense of gratitude of the love that really matters and may the world be drawn to Jesus Christ through our gratitude. Truly, as one saint has said, "If the only prayer we ever prayed was, 'Thank you', that would be enough."

SONGS OF ASCENT

In Old Testament times the Jewish religion required all males to worship in the Temple (in Jerusalem) at least three times per year. Presumably, whole families made the trip. On their way, the pilgrims sang songs of reflection and honor to God as they headed up to Jerusalem. These songs of ascent are recorded in Psalms 120-134. Psalm 125, says, "Those who trust in the Lord are like Mount Zion, which cannot be moved, but abides forever. As the mountains surround Jerusalem, so the Lord surrounds his people, from this time forth and forevermore."

Carl and I have just returned from the West Coast Presbyterian Pastors' Conference at Mount Hermon in the Santa Cruz Mountains, where we are surrounded by the mountains in a very peaceful setting. We try to make this pilgrimage annually and we are so thankful for the support of First Presbyterian and Christ Presbyterian churches. The retreat consists of Bible teaching, worship and fellowship with other pastors and families, and an opportunity to come away from church duties and be refreshed and reflect on the Easter season we've just come through. One of the perennial favorite hymns as we worship is "Great is Thy Faithfulness," which reminds us that God is faithful. He is our refuge, our strength, and our hope forever. He does not change. He is our stronghold – like the mountains surrounding Jerusalem.

Since we are in the Easter season we also sing "Rejoice, the Lord is King" (Darwall's tune, like in our hymnal). "Rejoice the Lord is King" also has a variant text based on Psalm 148, a "hymnic" psalm, (the hymn with the alternate text is then called *Darwall's* 148th). A more modern rendition of "Rejoice the Lord is King" can be found in the Getty / Townend song "Come, People of the Risen King." Also, Graham Kendrick, another modern hymn writer, has penned "Psalm 148", which we sing from time to time. These are our current day "songs of ascent" as we enter into worship at FPC.

No matter what we sing at the conference, we are always blessed to be there and to fellowship with other people who serve the Lord. The "iron sharpens iron" phrase comes to mind in reference to the retreat. We come away with fresh insight on how the Lord works in our lives and in the lives of our fellow Christians.
