

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ.

2022 is upon us. It is kind of jolting. COVID time has both been eternal and instant. It is like being in a parallel universe sometimes. On the one hand, we are seeing the joy and fruit of living into the vision of "opening the gospel to Carson City and beyond." We try to be intentional about discerning God's leading: living into our call to bless this community in word, deed, presence and witness.

On the other hand, we are still wrestling with the limitations of living through a pandemic. As of this writing, the "Omicron" variant is dominating the news and it has the feel of March 2020 all over again. Uncertainty is a real complication as we figure out what we can and cannot do. Trying to get from Point A to Point B often is not a linear exercise; we are still



adapting and re-adapting as circumstances around us change from week to week (if not day by day).

So, with that in mind, let me suggest that we are living like the Israelites in desert-like circumstances. Specifically, what I mean by that is this: we are abundantly aware of our need to depend solely upon God for our day-to-day walk. We hear anew God's words to Moses, "Now you shall see what I shall do." (Exodus 6) There, God was telling Moses that He was going to demonstrate his power such that Pharaoh would – not only *let* the people go – Pharoah would *drive* the people out of his land.

"Seeing what God will do" is such a great summary for the task assigned to us. It is the task assigned to believers. Yes, there are times we are called to action. Yes, there are times we are called to step out in faith. But even in the busy-ness of life and the challenges of the times, we are called to "see what God will do." There are several aspects of "see" that we can take on as resolutions in 2022.

First, "to see" means we need to look. I often need the reminder; if I do not look, I certainly will not see. If I am not reminded, I can get distracted and go for long stretches down rabbit holes. I do not think I am alone in that. When the internet was first introduced, we saw and heard of many people losing hours surfing – completely unaware of how much time they were spending on nothing. Now, it is Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, or Tik-Tok. That's just one illustration of the kind of distraction that can captivate our attention while distracting us away from looking to see what God is doing. The news, sports, gossip – these are all distractions from looking. We need to look with eyes to see what God is doing.

Second, "to see" means to understand. Comprehending what God is doing requires us to have an appreciation for the character and purpose of God – which is what God reveals in and through Scripture. In Isaiah 42, the LORD says, "I am the LORD, that is my name; my glory I give to no other,

nor my praise to idols. See, the former things have come to pass, and new things I now declare; before they spring forth, I tell you of them. Sing to the LORD a new song, his praise from the end of the earth!" We understand that God has promised us eternal life in Jesus Christ; that those in Christ are new creations. We understand that eternity includes now, and that we are living into the Kingdom of God that Jesus proclaimed. We understand these things in the context of a broken world in which circumstances can often look very different than the glorious hope we have in Jesus. Yet, we know that God is with us because He has so promised, "even unto the end of the age." We study, we worship, we gather together in fellowship to strengthen one another in our understanding of what God is doing and what God will do.

Third, we "see" in order to proclaim. "You will be my witnesses," the risen Jesus told the disciples as He was about to ascend. We are to tell what we have seen. In 1 John 1, the Apostle wrote, "We declare to you what was from the beginning, what we have heard, what we have seen with our eyes, what we have looked at and touched with our hands, concerning the word of life — "meaning Jesus "...so that you also may have fellowship with us; and truly our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ." When we talk about "opening the gospel to Carson City and beyond," we are following the example described and set forth by the Apostle John.


What will we see when we look, understand, and proclaim? Well, if God does what God has been doing, we will see the fruit of that faithfulness in lives transformed by grace, in opportunities opening to go forth and producing a great harvest, in fellowship strengthened on the foundation of love, and in ways we cannot yet imagine. But because God is faithful to His promises, we can trust that we *will* "now see what I shall do."

I pray 2022 is a year in which we are all newly amazed by the mighty acts of God.

#### LOTTIE SCOTT MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Since it has been several years since anything has appeared in The Trumpet about this fund, I thought it was time to familiarize all of you with who Lottie Scott was, how the fund was set up, and its purpose.



<u>Biography</u>: Lottie was an active member of the Carson City community. After being widowed in her fifties, she became very involved in this church. She gave many hours and gifts of service. She chaired the Christian Education Committee, was the Sunday School Superintendent and held the office of Treasurer for Presbyterian Women. Lottie also was the first female Elder at this church. When Lottie died in 1970, session set up this fund in her memory and to honor her many accomplishments. It was funded by donations from people in the congregation. Over the years, many young people have benefited from this fund.

Who qualifies to apply: This fund is available to individuals who were involved in our church while growing up or whose parents and/or grandparents have been active members. Priority is to be given to those who would like to go into Christian Education. The fund is also available to anyone from our church who wishes to further their education through college or a trade school.

<u>Scholarship Amount</u>: The amount of each scholarship is not to exceed \$1,000. Scholarships are subject to approval of the Finance Committee.

Application Period: Prior to the beginning of any college semester or quarter.

January's meeting is on the 25th. Everyone is welcome—bring your own lunch and your great ideas of interesting topics to discuss, things to do, etc.




The Wednesday morning and evening Pastor's Study will begin again on February 9.


#### **OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD**
