From the Pastor's Desk

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Throughout the new year of 2020 you are going to hear, read, and see a lot of vision related metaphors. We want 20/20 vision. We want to see things clearly. The 20/20 phrase refers to visual acuity. The desire for good vision is true physically and it is true spiritually. As Jesus' disciples we want eyes to see what God is doing, ears ready to hear where God is calling, and hearts open to follow faithfully. In order to be able to know and discern God's communicating with us, we need to be invested in Scripture. So, as we begin this new year, let me help refocus our vision by referring you to ECO's Essential Tenets. The first thing our denomination declares essential is "God's Word: The Authority For Our Confession."



"The clearest declaration of God's glory is found in His Word, both incarnate and written. The Son eternally proceeds from the Father as His Word, the full expression of the Father's nature, and since in the incarnation the Word became flesh all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge are offered to His disciples. The written Word grants us those treasures, proclaims the saving gospel of Jesus Christ, and graciously teaches all that is necessary for faith and life. We glorify God by recognizing and receiving His authoritative self-revelation, both in the infallible Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments and also in the incarnation of God the Son. We affirm that the same Holy Spirit who overshadowed the virgin Mary also inspired the writing and preservation of the Scriptures. The Holy Spirit testifies to the authority of God's Word and illumines our hearts and minds so that we might receive both the Scriptures and Christ Himself aright."

Beginning with scripture makes several important claims. It says that God has revealed himself. God has made himself known and knowable. God cares about us personally and corporately. It is remarkable to consider how the creator of everything knows my name and knows me more intimately than I know myself. I understand the awe of Psalm 8. God has given us scripture that we might know him, understand how we are known by him, and to understand his command to love one another.

This follows along with what Scripture says about itself. In 2 Timothy 3, Paul wrote to his young friend, "But as for you, continue in what you have learned and firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it, and how from childhood you have known the sacred writings that are able to instruct you for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, so that everyone who belongs to God may be proficient, equipped for every good work." The writer of Hebrews says this in chapter 4, "Indeed, the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing until it divides soul from spirit, joints from marrow; it is able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart. And before him no creature is hidden, but all are naked and laid bare to the eyes of the one to whom we must render an account." Proficiency is a mark of seeing clearly. If the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edge sword, then the fear of the Lord really is the beginning of wisdom – of seeing the world and our place in it.

In a world that wants to distort reality to its own pleasure and refuses to acknowledge the consequences of straying from God's created order, we have the sure and steady anchor of scripture to guard our hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. We need to walk with one another in reading and reflecting on what scripture teaches because it has all that is necessary for faith and life.

Our dues go to help with the Administration of our denomination. They help churches with health, pension and retirement benefits. Our mission committee can access information from them in times of disasters, as to how we can help and partner with churches in need.

Happy New Year! Time for new beginnings and fresh starts. I know that we will have repeat performances of certain activities and opportunities to serve, and on top of that, I know we will explore even more fun opportunities to grow in relationship with one another. You've heard about and experienced our big activities, but here's a look into what we are learning about in Sunday school:

Miss Deana spent December teaching Advent to the preschoolers and kindergarteners, starting with the prophecies in Isaiah, through Jesus' birth. They had a birthday party, and she has a lot of fun with them acting out scenes, playing games, and doing crafts. As we start 2020, she is going to take them back to Genesis, and work from creation through Adam and Eve, Noah, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and Joseph. We finished the Bible Unit and have begun work in the Creed Unit. They are beginning to think on a deeper level, and it's exciting to see the "Aha!" moments.

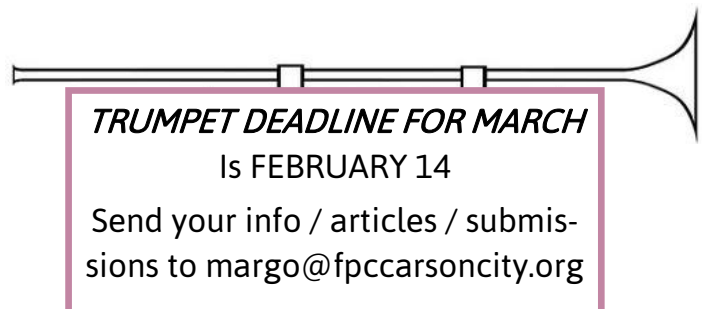

Worship –Hint: It’s Not About Us!

As we turn the calendar page into a new year, and now a new decade (!), it’s always good to evaluate where we’ve been both personally and as a church.

Having come through 24 years with one pastor, we have had the luxury of a long tenure to get to know God’s heart through our relationship with Pastor Bruce. It is fitting that at the beginning of a new decade, we are learning to get to know God’s heart through our new relationship with Pastor Bob. With this transition we continue to reach out to help others in need and to demonstrate the Gospel working in our lives. When we come together in worship, we come to demonstrate to God our devotion to Him and our willingness to be used by Him to reach others.

We all have ideas about what it means to worship God. Our humanness would like us to make worship about us and our preferences, but that is not what worship is. Worship is declaring the “worthiness” of God. We don’t get to define that. Only God, Who sent His Son to save us, gets to decide what He will accept as our act of worship.

I believe that God wants us to be open to using different ways of saying the “same” thing to Him. Our lives, our tithes, our hearts and mouths, our bodies, our gifts, our brains, our very beings. That certainly is a variety of ways to worship (think dance, music, art, hospitality, compassion, “entertaining angels unaware”, doing, writing). So from the musical side then, it is fitting that we use a variety of musical means to achieve the goal of speaking to each others’ hearts about God. In Colossians 3, Paul goes through a litany of the things that are “above” and not things of earth. “For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God.” He also talks about the things of the old life and how they must be put to death. He asks us to be in unity in Christ Jesus. He reminds us that we once, before we knew Jesus, walked in those “old self” ways that demanded we continue to focus on ourselves.

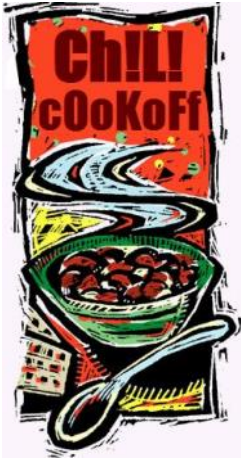
In bringing a music program of a church to fruition, one must be open first to God leading the way. In addition, one must be able to see the advantages of a variety of different styles of music and not be swayed only by one’s own preference. Running a music program at FPC means that we are open to including as many folks who have gifts in worship arts as possible. Be that art, choral music, praise music, liturgical dance, instrumental pieces, or whatever folks can bring in excellence to the table. It also means working with many different people and temperaments. Relationship building is very important in this endeavor. In all, what one strives to do is work at helping us all grow through this offering of love for our Lord.

Too easily we humans can get wrapped up in what we can do for God and not wait for Him to show us how we can offer our very beings to Him in a manner that He will accept as our worship. This is where we need to let “the word of Christ dwell” in us richly. We are commanded in Colossians 3:16 to “teach and admonish one another in all wisdom, singing psalms, and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness” in our “hearts to God.”

So even if we are the most outstanding person to direct or sing or play or fill in the blank, and we do it out of a purpose OTHER than with thankfulness in our hearts to God, then we are like the Corinthians 13 gong or clanging cymbal to God’s ears. I am reminded of a song that the Praise Team will be bringing to worship in January, called “Nobody”. The words of the chorus say, “I’m just a nobody, tryin’ to tell everybody all about somebody Who saved my soul. Ever since You rescued me, You gave my heart a song to sing. I’m living for the world to see nobody but Jesus.” And that is what worship is about: it is about offering to God, our very selves and about “being” Jesus to our neighbors and strangers. And the goal is for others to see Jesus in us and not us “doing” for Jesus.
