

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

I thought I would begin 2023 with the first question and answer of the Heidelberg Catechism.

- Q1. What is your only comfort, in life and in death?
- A. That I belong—body and soul, in life and in death—not to myself but to my faithful Savior, Jesus Christ. At the cost of his own blood he has fully paid for all my sins and has completely freed me from the dominion of the devil. He protects me so well that without the will of my Father in heaven not a hair can fall from my head. Indeed, everything must fit his purpose for my salvation. Therefore, by his Holy Spirit, he also assures me of eternal life, and makes me wholeheartedly willing and ready from now on to live for him.



This is such good news to share. "I belong." How powerful is that understanding. We are not alone; and we have not been left alone. It is both comforting and compelling to know that God has taken the initiative to claim me as his own. God values *me* and has taken action to draw me to himself. I am – at all times – in relationship with God, who loves me. I matter to God.

The reason why I am focusing on this essential truth is because there is an overwhelming reality in the broken world that we are all alone. Not only are we told that we are alone and responsible for ourselves, we are acting into that truth by our behavior.

A recent study revealed that Americans 15 years old and older are spending significantly more time alone than they did ten years ago. The amount of time spent with friends and companions each week decreased by about 4-5 hours; the amount of time spent by themselves each week increased by 9 hours. The trend *predated* the pandemic. And, although young people are going to deal with the chronic effects of this trend, the data shows that the isolation pattern is consistent across all ages.

The amount teens have face-to-face interactions with others has dropped consistently since 1970, but precipitously since 2010. The reports of loneliness and mental health issues has increased in correlation, jumping up dramatically since 2010. There is a growing sense of isolation, loneliness, and hopelessness because virtual relations do not care. The New York Times headline read, "It's Life Or Death': The Mental Health Crisis Among U.S. Teens." The subhead was, "Depression, self-harm and suicide are rising among American adolescents." It is discomforting.

How relevant, then, is the good news we have to share. The gospel is a comfort – it is the *only* comfort we have. When we talk about "opening the gospel to Carson City and beyond," we are not imposing a burden. We have to know how we are offering water to those dying of thirst. Belonging is a message of hope, of joy, of... well, let me say it bluntly: life.

I am so grateful to have been called to serve in a community that understands – and lives – the hope of the faith we have been given. It is such a blessing to share with one another the encouragement of our witness. When you tell me how God has touched and transformed your life, I am strengthened and renewed. When you tell me how you have seen God work in the lives of others around you, I rejoice and give thanks to God for

revealing his enduring steadfast love. When together we see God drawing new people and raising them up to active involvement in the mission He has set before us, I can only marvel at God's faithfulness.

As we go into 2023, I ask you to join me in the following:

- Pray for God to open opportunities for us to share the gospel in word and deed.
- ◆ Talk with one another about what God has already done and what we see God doing right now. Then, talk with one another about where we are discerning God calling us to go forward.
- Commit to looking for ways to be salt and light to this community in the name of Jesus. Where are those who are lost, lonely, despairing, or hopeless? Where are those who are searching; those whom God is tugging on their hearts?
- Invest in seeking first God's kingdom. Remember: we are called to movement. We are commissioned to follow where Jesus leads. Let us be intentional about stepping out, in faith, with good news, into a world desperate to hear the message.

I look forward to seeing what God will do in this new year. May God fill you with expectant hope, too. Your brother in Christ,
