From the Pastor's Desk

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ.

Lent is a time to pause and reflect on the meaning of Christ's Passion: his life, suffering, crucifixion, death, and – thankfully – resurrection.

Pausing and reflecting are not easily done in the midst of the busy-ness of the daily routine. Phone calls, responsibilities, traffic, media, and other things keep us from opening up time to simply reflect. It can be difficult to "be still and know that I am God." We are more comfortable in being busy – being still often makes us feel like we are not doing anything worthwhile.



Pausing and reflecting can be difficult in the midst of a pandemic, too. Most people have established a new rhythm, but still long for the "old normal." The new rhythm has its own form of busy-ness. Pausing and reflecting have not risen to the top of the priority list; instead, we are seeking to find more ways to avoid the quiet and silence that has been imposed via social isolation.

Mark D. Roberts, who was the pastor at Irvine Presbyterian Church in Orange County before moving to be the Scholar In Residence at the Laity Lodge (www.markdroberts.com) once did a series on discerning the will of God. In the midst of talking about how to "have an ear to hear the Holy Spirit," he broached the topic of silence.

Silence can be scary, especially for those of us who aren't used to it. We can be afraid that silence will be boring. Or we may be afraid that in silence we'll have to deal with hard things in our life that we'd rather avoid. For example, when I spend quiet time with God, I'm often reminded of things I have done wrong. God brings these to mind so that I may confess them and be forgiven, and so that I may talk with Him about how I can do better in the future. But the experience of remembering forgotten sins isn't particularly pleasant. Many of us fill our lives with noise because we don't want to face our fears, our hurts, or our disappointments, in addition to our sins.

He recommended to his congregation that each person take one hour per *month* to be in silence before the LORD. I think this is a good idea, so I am passing this along to you.

It will take some work to carve out a full hour when you will commit yourself to silence. Silence does not necessarily mean rigid and motionless, but the reality is we are more distract-able if we move around. It *does* mean no music or television or radio or other things that provide a "white noise" background to our days. (As I am writing this, I realized I have an Homepod mini playing here in the office.)

From the Pastor's Desk

I encourage you to try an hour of silence during this Lenten season. Remembering the road Jesus walked; remembering why Jesus walked that road; and remembering how our lives are different because Jesus walked that road are all topics to get you started.

"For I handed on to you as of first importance what I in turn had received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, and that he was buried, and that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas (Peter), then to the twelve." (I Corinthians 15:3-5). This is the good news we have received, it is the good news we have to share with everyone around us.

May we grow to love God more deeply and know God more intimately as we take time to listen and meditate on His word.

Family Ministries



Question:

How do you minister in family ministries when we are distanced and not gathering in large groups?

Great question! I started as Family Ministry Coordinator mid-July 2019. I've now spent more time in this position during the pandemic than not. It's really given me time to think and reflect on the state of ministry now and going forward. One of my original goals was to have family events that brought us all together in fun, engaging activities. We had a BBQ, candy making, a board painting party. All of the teachers and children gathered together in one room before Sunday school to sing and pray together. And then.

To be honest with you, there has been a lot of floundering. Being new to ministry, I was just getting my feet wet during normal times. Everything I was working toward was gone. Study and prayer helped. Reaching out to people via video and phone calls was at least a way to connect. Then, fairly quickly, it became apparent that the videoing of services and Wednesday announcements not only wasn't going to go away, it was going to become more important than anything we could have imagined.

We have, within a few short months, established Aunt Betty's Studio, reimagined our website and social media presence, gone live for Sunday services, through Praises and Paper Folding and Wednesday announcements, found outlets for our own video production education, AND started PresbyPod podcast!

Ministering to people, sharing God's love, hasn't changed. How we deliver that message has. From trepidation at all of the technology to excitement at what comes next, we are eager to share this new to us ministry vehicle both within our church and reaching out to our community. How can we best share the Good News of Jesus's redeeming love with those who most need to hear it?

You are a big part of this! Already people are reaching out with project proposals. Others are eager to be involved with the filming/recording and editing process. We have room for anyone ~ no experience needed. Hove the creative process of editing. Once I understood the basic functions of the editing software, branching out into effects has been very easy. But we also need analytical people who can spot the details and make adjustments accordingly. If you feel a calling to this ministry, don't let the technology intimidate you. We are here to help and guide, and eventually take a back seat to those much more talented than ourselves. We have the ability to reach out to so many more than we used to, and you can be directly involved, in small group, distanced, gatherings. How exciting!



And...We ARE meeting for Sunday School again. I'm sending out Virtual Sunday School materials each week for those not yet ready to gather. As we approach Spring, we will be scheduling outdoor activities. If you want to help with hikes, bike rides, lake days, etc. please contact me!

The Journey - Part I

As we wait in hope for our world to overcome this virus and open back up, I would like to offer a few observations:

Our entire lives are journeys from the womb to the grave (and beyond). We should live them in awe and wonder for what God has done and is doing in them.

In our journey, we tend to gravitate toward that which we know and to be comfortable with what gives us pleasure and assurance, aside from God. The "concrete" things of life — if you will. We need to take our blinders off and shake off our self-made delusions and seek to view life through the lens of God.

Oh that we would see clearly through the lens of God! I believe that God has given us this time to pause and reflect on what His great gift to all of humanity has done for us. As we enter Lent, I pray we will take the time to ponder, each day, the meaning of this

40-day period of preparation leading up to Easter. During Lent, I will be doing a daily devotional that consists of poetry, Biblical commentary, and reflection. It is by Malcolm Guite and was recommended to me by the Getty Hymn Initiative Group. I would encourage us all to spend time during this season in meditating on the meaning of Lent. In this first part, we will look at the elements of Lent: confession/repentance, ash and the palms.

Confession/repentance - from our worldliness, selfishness, "exclusiveness", our need for power, our pride (both secular and spiritual). Jesus suffers each of these with us and for us as He is tempted by Satan. Jesus makes a choice to resist Satan and call him out; we need to make the same choice. (Guite)

Ash - though it is the end of structure, it is also a fertilizer that will renew and give life when added to a garden. Therefore, though it is a symbol of our fallenness, ashes on one's head were a sign of mourning and grief, ash also opens our hearts to receive the renewal of the Spirit within us that occurs when we confess and repent.

Palms - Palm branches symbolized goodness, well-being, grandeur, steadfastness, and victory. They were often found on coins and important buildings. King Solomon had palm branches carved into the walls and doors of the temple.(1Kings 6:29). These tokens of joy were customarily used on festive occasions. Kings and conquerors were greeted with them. The people celebrating Jesus thought that He had come as a political leader to overthrow the Romans, not as the suffering servant of mankind. Revelation 7 says palms will be used again to celebrate Jesus. The ancient tradition of weaving the palm fronds from the Palm Sunday celebration into a cross shape reminds us of how quickly the tide turned during Holy Week, when those who had celebrated the Messiah's entrance into Jerusalem now called for His crucifixion. In many churches, the palms of the previous year's celebration are burned for the ash of Ash Wednesday.

Next month we will take a look at the elements directly related to Passion Week and Easter. In this season of Lent, may we seek the deeper meaning of our encounters with the Bible and the symbols of this season.




