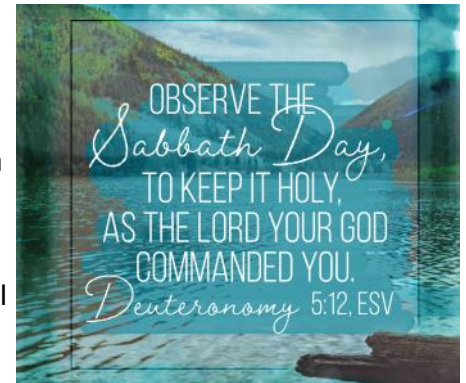

## *From the Pastor's Desk*

Dear Church,

As I take stock of the last few months, my first months as your pastor, I am struck by a number of things. I think happily on what a privilege it has been to get to know you, my family in Jesus and my co-laborers in the mission of our church. I think of how my days have had fewer and fewer surprises as I've gotten to know the patterns of life and ministry in our church. I think of how grateful I am to be here with my family, doing life with all of you! And I also think about how life is much busier here in a larger city and at a larger church.



I find that this faster pace and busier life is a lot of fun, but also that I need to change some of my habits in order to find the rest that I need. This shouldn't be surprising; rest is a rare commodity in our world. The demands of job, family, friendship, church life, and many other things often fill our schedule to bursting, leaving us wondering how we will get it all done. Most of us take the approach of working harder, getting up earlier and going to bed later, skipping meals if necessary to get it all done. And that approach may seem to work – for a while at least.

But even though the Bible clearly identifies work as a good (Adam and Eve were given the job of tending the garden *before* sin entered the world, after all!), it is equally clear that we are, by nature, limited in just how much we can and ought to do. We must pause to eat and drink, or our energy will be depleted and our bodies will cease to function. We must sleep regularly (according to one source the average human being will sleep the equivalent of 9,490 days, or 227,760 hours!). Our bodies tell us that our physical endurance is not unlimited, and the same is true for our emotional endurance.

God reinforces this truth in the fourth commandment: "Remember the sabbath day, and keep it holy. Six days you shall labor and do all your work. But the seventh day is a sabbath to the Lord your God; you shall not do any work – you, your son or your daughter, your male or female slave, your livestock, or the alien resident in your towns." (Exodus 20:8-10) Every seventh year was also to be observed as a sabbath year in which no crops would be planted; the labor of six days was to be enough for a seventh, and the labor of six years was to be enough for a seventh year as well (Lev. 25:3-7). God commanded rest for His people, knowing that they would need it, and He promised to supply their needs if they would trust Him in observing Sabbath.

But we rebel against rest, against God's provision of sabbath, don't we? The weight of our problems, our deadlines, and the opportunities before us make us struggle against rest rather than embrace it. I heard a pastor once say that his church routinely congratulated him for breaking the fourth commandment, for not using all his vacation days, for staying late regularly and working seven days per week. "Good job on ignoring the fourth commandment pastor, God clearly didn't mean that one. He just needed another commandment to end up at a round number!"

We need to remember the order of operations in the ministry of our church; God is not relying on us to get the job done, we are relying on Him. It's His strength and goodness and wisdom that gets the job done. In ECO's sabbath document our role in God's work is defined in this way: "This is a mission, not of building, of co-creating cosmos with God... It is a mission of revealing the reconciliation of all things that God is accomplishing by his power alone. *We, however, get to participate by embodying the reconciling work of God.* Thus, God is accomplishing his mission through us, even if not through our power."

Our job is not to achieve and accomplish, but to *live* what God has done for us. Our job is not only to do, but to rest, because rest is what God has provided for us in Jesus! He has given us rest from the power and

condemnation of sin; He has given us rest from having to solve all the world's problems; He has given us rest by sustaining us when life threatens to crush us; He has given us rest by killing the great enemy, death; He has given us rest by lifting off of us the responsibility to restore Eden; "So then, a sabbath rest still remains for the people of God; for those who enter God's rest also cease from their labors as God did from his. Let us therefore make every effort to enter that rest..." (Hebrews 4:9-11a). It's as if the author of Hebrews is saying, "Let us make every effort to enter God's rest by... resting!" We are to trust that as we take the rest we need God will still give fruit to our labor.

So here is my question to you this month: it's not "What will you accomplish" or "what new volunteer opportunity will you sign up for." Instead, how will you allow rest to shape your work? Let me give you a few suggestions:

- 1) Make a list of all the things you have to do this month, and then take that list to God regularly *before* you start to work. Make it a habit to make time to spend with the Lord and His people as a precursor to your work.
- 2) Set aside a regular period of time that is purely for rest and that you will not allow anything (other than a true emergency, as in Luke 14:5) to violate. Recognize that doing this is an act of faith, and call on God to provide for this time.
- 3) Talk with a friend to discover areas of weariness and worry in your life that you may not be recognizing. Read Matthew 6:25-34 and Philippians 4:4-7. Ask yourself, "What if these passages are an invitation to sabbath rather than a criticism of my thinking?"
- 4) Evaluate if the things you do for rest are actually leading you to Sabbath, or if they are just killing time. Are you simply ceasing from work, or are you being nourished in rest?

Finally, recognize just how counter-intuitive and counter-cultural it is to follow God's command and invitation to sabbath. If you're thinking, "Pastor Ian, this is a hopelessly naïve way of living," good! Stepping out in true faith nearly always seems crazy. And the whole world is crazy anyway, so I'd rather be crazy like Jesus than living any other way!
