
From the Pastor's Desk

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ.

This fall in the Pastor's Bible Study, we are going to be focused on Jesus' Sermon On The Mount – Matthew 5–7.

Matthew is the first Gospel in our New Testament, though it is unlikely to have been the first gospel written. Much of Matthew has been derived from the Gospel of Mark. As best we can tell, Matthew was written to a primarily Jewish-Christian audience.

It is an account of Jesus' life; not a simple biography of dates and accomplishments, but a narrative history of God's saving activity in and through Jesus Christ. God's grace is shown in the climactic death and resurrection of Jesus, which is the heart of the gospel. The gospel was not designed as a chronological record of the days like a newspaper; rather, it is a *thematic* re-telling of the importance of Jesus' life around five collections of Jesus' sayings.



It is a teaching document. It is structured to interpret the meaning of the events of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection to a community in order that they would believe the good news of God's salvation by grace through faith. That's a long sentence, but the gist of it is this: what God did in time with Jesus is essential to our lives.

If you turn to Matthew 1, you notice that the Gospel does not begin with the birth of Jesus. It begins with a lineage of Jesus' ancestry. Take a look at the genealogy Matthew provides. You will see that it is paragraphed into three sections: the first section is the Patriarchs, the second section is the Kings, and the third section is from the time of exile. God had been at work for generations preparing for the day Jesus would be born.

If you want to tie a group of scholars in knots, ask them what the genealogy means.

The Sermon on the Mount is the first of five discourses of Jesus in Matthew. It is the longest and most comprehensive. In the Sermon, Jesus expresses, teaches, reveals, and exhorts people to understand that the righteousness of the Kingdom of God – the standard for how life will be lived in the presence of God – is a "better-than" version of the covenant established with Moses at Sinai.

## Why Now?

It always is a good time to study the Sermon on the Mount. The specific reason to look now is because I believe we are in a Spring Training-type of situation as the church. The call to be witnesses in Carson City and beyond looks very different now than it did prior to the pandemic. The message is the same, but there is a renewed understanding of how essential are relationships to expressing the love of God to those who do not yet know Him. Thus, it is good to go back to basics to remember who we are and how we are called to be.

#### From the Pastor's Desk

The Sermon on the Mount gives us the fundamentals. It begins with the famous beatitudes, "Blessed are ..." statements. They serve as the foundation piece, as in: these are the characteristics of Christians. Then comes the essence piece: believers are salt and light. What follows from there is a much longer reflection of how the righteousness expressed in the law handed down by Moses was accurate, but the spirit of that righteousness needed to be integrated in the whole of the person; that is, it is not works righteousness, but a right relationship with God that is essential.

Being in right relationship with God *prepares* us to be in right relationship with one another. Being in right relationship with God *equips* us to be in right relationship with one another. Being in a right relationship with God *enables* us to be in a right relationship with one another. The discipline of fundamentals – the things Jesus revealed in this Sermon – are the foundation for how we learn to love our neighbor as ourselves.

The stronger we are together, the better we are able to share with others who are lost or questioning or despairing or are in crisis. In short: studying the Sermon on the Mount is our way of preparing to be sent out to "open the gospel to Carson City and beyond."

Come join us on Wednesdays at 10:00 a.m. or 6:30 p.m. beginning September 14.
