From the Pastor's Workshop

"What I Got to Do"

It is November. The fullness of fall is upon us. We are blessed to live where there is a season that ushers in a time of reflection. It says time is moving on. A time of looking inward is upon us. It is a season of gratitude and Thanksgiving. For Christians it is a time of remembering the gift of *getting to be stewards* of what God has entrusted to us. We will celebrate this with a Thanksgiving meal on November 24 following *one service* that begins at 10 AM. In that service we will dedicate our pledges; most of all, the ones we make in our hearts, as we remember what we got and get to do because God is faithful.

Recently I said in a sermon that instead of making a "bucket list" I am making a list of things I have been privileged to do already. Instead of what I WANT to do, I am exploring the wonder of gratitude that comes from thanking God for what I have been gifted to be a part of. At the very top of this is the list of stuff I didn't hold on to; things I might have desperately wanted, but that either did not come to or remain in my life. The reason this is at the top is because it is my way of thanking God for <u>His Way</u> in the life I have been given. By not being able to have or hold on to the things and dreams I had imagined there is room only for what God knows is best to happen to and through me.

As I make this list I am learning what a gift it has been to let money and time and energy flow out of me to the people and situations God knows have needed to be touched. And I am grateful that I didn't hold on because of how empty I would have felt if I had. I am grateful as hard as it has been at times that I didn't play it safe or by the rules of culture in trying to protect myself. I would have lost out. I might have been in my cozy place of "control" but I would have been so sorry.

Ann Voskamp's little book <u>One Thousand Gifts</u> has been very helpful. She reminds me that our best giving comes from receiving as she writes, "Receiving God's gifts is a gentle, simple movement of stooping lower." "Is this too", she asks, "why I'm often joy starved? Why a narcissistic, gluttonous world lives emaciated?" "Yes" is my answer. I cannot give if I will not receive what GOD has for me; if I am not simply giving thanks for the invitation to let go of life to God. Voskamp remind us, "Eucharisteo means 'to give thanks,' and to give is a verb, something that we do. God call me to do thanks. To give the thanks away. That thanks-giving might literally become thanks-living. That our lives become the very blessing we have received."

What have I received? What thanks have I been gifted to do? If I never live another year or day I got to be a servant of God, I got to be pastor of this church for 18 years, I got to be Nancy's husband for 37 years and Kate's dad for 25, I got to learn to not be attached to this world and I got to learn to take hold of God's kingdom as I walked with so many people in so many ways, so many of you, in learning what it means to point ever and always to Jesus. I got to let go of thinking that anything I think I HAVE to have in this life for meaning is likely the FIRST thing I need to let go. And my list is growing.

How about you? What do you know that God is enabling you to do as an act of Thanks-giving? As we spend time this fall and in the few years we have I encourage you to discover the treasure of this act and how it sets us free to give away the life Jesus gave us. It is so liberating to know we need so little in this world because we have everything in Jesus Christ and that we GET to give him to the world.

Worship - Repentance and Transformation

If you've been reading this column for the past few months, you've become acquainted with some of the key elements in a book I have read that is called, The Way of the Worshiper. The author is Buddy Owens. Some of you may know that his parents are the songwriters Jimmy and Carol Owens. Their song, If My People is in our church hymnal. I really appreciate Buddy's down to earth explanation of worship and I highly recommend this book if you would like to go deeper.

Last month we looked at conforming versus transforming. This month, I would like to take a look at one of the ways God transforms us.

Repentance is defined in various dictionaries as deep sorrow, compunction, or contrition for a past sin, wrongdoing, or regret for any past action. Repentance is spoken of in terms of transformation (Romans 12: 1-2 "do not conform any longer... but be transformed"). Repentance is not just an apology with the idea that we'll do better next time. We cannot repent once and forever be changed--our feet are stuck here on earth and we are a fallen people. True repentance is reflected in the choices we make. When we repent, we have to go a different way, moment by moment and day by day -- a 180 degree turn if you will.

The very act of repentance is an act of worship, because we are telling God we don't know all the answers and we are looking to Him to shape us. Repentance is surrender; its cooperating with God in our transformation. We don't repent to earn forgiveness -- we can't earn forgiveness, (Romans 5:8). Our sin has made us dead. Dead people cannot help themselves. At this point you might say, "how do you know I've sinned?" Remember that sin is our condition, from before we are born, because of the sin against God and broken relationship between God and Adam and Eve, (Genesis 3). All have "missed the mark".

Our response to the fact that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us -- repentance and gratitude. Buddy calls that our "heart posture" -- Surrender and thanksgiving. God's mercy and forgiveness makes me want to be a better disciple. Even though I don't always see myself as God sees me, in faith, having surrendered, I trust that He is making me into the person He wants me to be. He is transforming me. I am so grateful that God is able to do that through Christ's death and resurrection - because otherwise I will keep missing the mark; making a project out of my life that cannot be pleasing to God -- remember dead people cannot help themselves, that's why we need Christ.

As we come through November and this time of thanksgiving, God is calling us to reflect, repent and be renewed in His grace and mercy.

KIVA UPDATE

The Mission Committee has completed their 45th \$100 loan through KIVA, a non-profit organization that alleviates poverty through lending.

The above loan was made to Francis Nakuru in Kenya to purchase a water tank that will benefit six members of his family. KIVA works with field partners which provide financial and technical support. The field partner, SMEP, is a leading Christian microfinance organization in Kenya, operating since 1999. Their primary goal is to improve the standard of living of the poor and marginalized by providing access to credit and other services that stimulate economic growth. It is a nationwide institution with 20 branches and 18 satellites covering all major towns in Kenya.

This loan is part of SMEP's loan program to provide clean drinking water in partnership with Water.org. This program is designed to increase access to water by improving sanitation and constructing boreholes, shallow wells, water towers, and treatment plants.

This loan is not a loan to start a business, but a loan to improve the quality of life for Francis and his family.
