From the Pastor's Workshop

What Jesus Will Ask

Spring is upon us. New life comes forth from what has seemed dead. In our Christian faith nothing is more essential than the reality that our salvation comes from God's defeat of death itself to bring us to everlasting life. What we will celebrate on Sunday morning April 20 is what Peter said in Acts 4:12, "There is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among mortals by which we must be saved."

I love the simple clear truth of this statement. With this EVERYTHING is settled and without it NOTHING is. And the glory of Easter is living into this great gift that transcends the death that would hold us forever without this. And we get to tell people! We get to bring people to the empty tomb and say, "See! He really has risen." The renewal of our lives is the evidence.

We are in a time of listening for the leading of God's Holy Spirit about how we can best station ourselves in culture as the body of Christ to share this good news. April 1 at 10 AM and 7 PM we will have two more town hall meetings to give you an opportunity to learn about a possible move to a Presbyterian denomination called ECO that is as timeless as the Gospel itself, but as fresh and new as spring.

Whether we make this move and find it possible to do so is a matter of letting God's Holy Spirit lead us. If this is the right step for us, as Gamaliel said to the Sanhedrin in Acts 5:39, "...if it is of God, you will not be able to overthrow them – in that case you may even be found fighting against God!"

Here's what I want us to realize from "the upper story"; Jesus will not ask us what denomination we were in. He will ask us, "Did you tell every person you could about my resurrection promise that would deliver them from life to death." And this is why we need to know this story beyond all else, so that we are NOT distracted by what human identity is placed on the part of the body in which we find ourselves.

Making a denominational change on a human level is complicated and for some it is sad because being in one room in God's house has meant a great deal. I'm still wistful at times for the house in which I grew up! But I know where I am is the BEST place for me now because it is where God has me and I am so grateful.

I believe ECO can be the BEST place for us to grow into a new and yet timeless expression of proclaiming JESUS as the ONLY name that will give ANYONE hope. It is not only the best for now, but for the future and if it is right God will make the way clear. I ask you to join me in prayer as we seek God's leading in all the details. I pray that we will be one body in one accord as Paul says in Philippians 2 seeking the Lordship of Jesus and to be empty of anything less. May this clarify and unite us as we walk toward the cross and on to the empty tomb. And may we rejoice that we know the NAME that is above all names; the ONLY name that saves, Jesus.



"At the National Center for Biblical Parenting, we talk a lot about helping children change their hearts. You may be thinking, "My children don't know how to change their hearts." What does that mean anyway, and what can we expect in any given discipline situation.

When a child has done the wrong thing, it's often helpful to require some alone time with instructions like, "You need to take a break. Come back and we'll talk about this after you change your heart." Kids may not understand how it happens, but with practice they can learn to change their hearts. A change of heart in children involves four steps:

(1) Stop fighting, calm down, and be willing to talk about the problem; (2) Acknowledge having done something wrong; (3) Be willing to change; and (4) Commit to doing right.

These are all steps that a child can do. Ideally we would also like to see two other steps take place:

(5) Feel sorrow for doing wrong; and (6) Have a desire to do what's right.

That may sound like a lot, but kids grow into this process slowly and we can help them through the steps. If your son has been disrespectful in the way he spoke to you, first he needs to stop and settle down and be willing to work on the problem. Then secondly, he needs to acknowledge that he was wrong. Thirdly, he needs to be willing to respond differently next time. And lastly, he needs to commit to trying to do better.

Sometimes children may only settle down (Step #1) in the "break". Then they are ready to process the other steps with the parent. Other times, children may be able to work through all four steps and then just report back to the parent. The only prerequisite for coming back from a break is that a child be willing to work on changing the heart. Remember, "Man looks at the outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart." (1 Samuel 16:7) Teaching children to change their hearts is a valuable lesson that they will benefit from for the rest of their lives."

If you'd like to hear more from the National Center for Biblical Parenting, let Nancy know. They have many resources available, including a video parenting class we could look into!







Worship and Community -

"Worship is essentially communal. Christian community is necessary for (Christian) worship. It is something that is done together - not just physically, but together in one spirit. Community is more than an aggregate group of persons offering up individual praises and prayers to God. Community is one praise, one prayer, one song that is being offered by a unified group of worshipers precisely because community is already a divine reality. When people express worship in the same service in ways that may not hold the same degree of meaning to them personally, they gladly share in the expression anyway, knowing that every element holds meaning for someone in their community. As (Dietrich) Bonhoeffer states, 'Even if a verse or a psalm is not one's own prayer, it is nevertheless the prayer of another member of the fellowship.'" So begins a section of the book, *The Worship Architect* (Constance M. Cherry, Baker Academic, 2010).

As we come into worship each week, we are called to active participation as we are challenged to pray with one voice, to sing in one voice, and to experience the God of the universe in fellowship with one another. Our community is modeled for us by the fellowship of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit -- a unique fellowship that requires no other input. If we think of our worship as being a structure (like an architect thinks of a building), our structure must be without a ceiling. When there is no ceiling, I like to think of the worship being lifted up and mingling with the worship that is going on in Heaven. Not only do we worship with those who have gone before us, we are being prepared for the eternal worship in the days to come. As such we experience a unity of spirit and the dynamic of active worship across the ages -- past, present, and future.

Bonhoeffer wrote, "We belong to one another only through and in Jesus Christ." In other words, we are in community together because of our relationship with Christ. Whether we feel it or not, we are community because it exists whether we realize it or not due to our relationship to Christ. Another way of thinking of community with reference to Church is "Christian community is an interdependent fellowship of believers who share life together in ways that bear witness to the love and mercy of God." (Thornton)

As we move through Lent we reflect on the atoning work of Jesus Christ on our behalf. In our gratitude for this incredible redemption, let us pray as one community for discernment in the season that faces First Presbyterian Church. Ask questions, attend meetings and talk about how we can best do the mission we are called to here in Carson City. Our prayers and praises as one unified church need to seek God's will for His glory. How best can

we worship and serve the God of the Universe?


