From the Pastor's Workshop

"LEARNING TO WALK FROM JESUS"

Do you remember learning to walk? Not many of us do; though some have had to learn to walk again after surgery or an accident. I think it must be easier when we are small and don't know what a huge deal we are undertaking or what we will face once we learn!

Spiritual walking is not something we learn in a few months and then never really think about again. Learning to walk with Jesus happens again and again in each chapter of life. That is why we have a church year and why God intended for us to repeat Christmas, the Lord's Supper, and now Easter. Jesus came to teach us to walk in HIS ways. The best way to learn to walk is to repeat what he has shown us. And the best way to show someone else is to show them his ways. That is what these days are about; learning to walk from Jesus; knowing that as we do he will be gracious and meet us where we are and pick us up when we fall down.

One of the most moving and informing parts of our time in Israel is when we walk in Jesus' steps through the old city of Jerusalem. We truly do live the words, "I walked today where Jesus walked." And as we do this we realize that he is teaching us to be like him; to let go on needing anything but to be at the Father's direction. This can happen right here as we are learning to listen for Jesus' direction. It can happen as we read in his word about the steps he took to love us into a redeemed relationship with himself. And this can happen when we let his steps be the corrective for our own; the steps that pick us up and send us in a new direction.



We want this to happen in these days for every member here, but also for every person with whom we have contact so that they may see the words to the Hebrews lived out in us, "*Therefore lift your drooping hands, and strengthen our weak knees, and make straight path for your feet, so that what is lame may not be put out of joint, but rather be healed.*"

We belong to the God who heals! Nowhere was this more apparent than when he went to the cross for us. We remember this as we walk with Jesus through the streets of Jerusalem right here in Carson City. On Good Friday, April 14, you and I and our friends can do just this in the sanctuary from 1:00 to 7:00 p.m. as we remember each of the places Jesus stopped to think about just why he was doing this for all of us. I encourage you to come to this experience. It will be one of the most important faith steps you can take. The night before, April 13 at 7:00 p.m., will likewise teach us to walk with Jesus as we gather for our Tenebrae Service.

The Service of Tenebrae marks Christ's time in the Garden of Gethsemane, where he prayed and prepared to go to the Cross. At the close of the service, the pastors gradually extinguish candles while reading passages from the Gospels, and the service ends in darkness and silence.

On Good Friday (April 14), we will have an open-house format Stations of the Cross exhibit from 1:00 to 7:00 p.m. It will consist of 15 interactive stations created by a team of our members. JOURNEYING WITH JOY ~

Each spring, I find myself anticipating the wonderful opportunities that may come my way as the weather warms and the days grow longer. It feels like a time when not only the earth awakens from its winter slumber, but my spirit is renewed. It gives me joy to watch the trees bud and the flowers bloom. Though not a



gardener myself, I can appreciate God's handiwork in conjunction with those who undertake the tasks needed to garden. The Apostle Paul speaks in terms of such tasks in the kingdom. He speaks of planting and watering (1 Cor. 3:6), and he states that when the servants of God have done this, God is the One who grows the believer.

Years ago, I wondered why certain opportunities had not come my way in music. What I finally realized is that God has specific tasks for me and for all of us as His servants. He assigns these in order that we might grow into His people. If we are faithful in executing those tasks, however small they seem, God uses them so we are able to better respond to other opportunities He sends our way, as He

sees fit. Sometimes He pushes us way beyond our comfort zone and other times He allows us to stretch and grow within the tasks He has given. But always, He enables us to do the task He has set before us. Sometimes we need to take the first step of a task in faith. When we experience peace and joy in these tasks, we can be sure that they are God ordained.

Our unique and specific gifts are given by God. And before you say "but I'm not gifted in anything", think about what in your life gives you joy. Paul talks about everyone working toward the goal of spreading the Gospel in 1 Corinthians 12, and how everything we do must fit God's purpose for salvation within us and within the church. Some of us are teachers and exhorters, some of us are guest welcomers, nurturers, encouragers, child educators, prayer warriors, or musicians. Our strengths, talents and spiritual gifts are uniquely given by God. When we develop and use those gifts for God's Kingdom and not our edification, we will experience the utmost joy of serving Him and glorifying Him. Not in a prideful way, but in a way that draws us closer to Him and humbles us before Him. We need to seek first the Kingdom of God. I pray for joy in our journey together to the cross.

Sadly, this is becoming more difficult for Doris to do and she would like to give it up. She is legally blind and she and her husband "Wheels" like to travel a great deal.

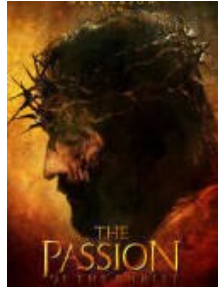
It would be wonderful if a volunteer, or volunteers, would come forward to continue this lovely tradition that so brightens our day.

BELIZE MISSION UPDATE

This year we are blessed to have three new Mission team members from our church: Cindy McEwan, Kyle Hamilton, and Sharon Hughes. In May, we will join members of Village Church (Incline Village) in Seine Bight, Belize. There we will be working on another construction project, while the rest of the team attends to the



dental needs of the villagers. This year there is a very different need: We will be helping Miss Kim and her six children, who are homeless. Her sister is sharing her home with them, but it is very cramped. All the children sleep in one bed, while Miss Kim sleeps in the hallway. We will put an enclosure under her sister's house to create a comfortable room, with windows for ventilation for Miss Kim and her children. Also, we plan to replace some very dilapidated and unsafe steps. They are excited that we are coming to help them. Please keep us in your prayers while we are on the Mission trip. And please consider donating to the building supply fund. The past Missions have been a tremendous success thanks to your prayers and support.


