## "The Bridge"

In June the Supreme Court of the United States by a narrow 5-4 decision ruled that "same-sex marriage" is legal in all 50 states. As one whose college degree was focused largely in US History I was puzzled by this because it is my understanding, (and incidentally that of Justice John Roberts) that it is not the place of the Supreme Court to decide this for the states. As a theologian I was even more puzzled because I do not believe it is the place of the United States Supreme Court to rule on something that THE Supreme Court has said is defined as being between one man and one woman. We may change human laws, but we cannot change what God has told us about himself.

My larger concern is what is going to happen to our culture; our world when it reaches "The Chasm". The Chasm is described by a series of drawings in which people are shown carrying crosses. One by one they discover their cross to be too heavy so they stop again and again to cut off part of the cross to make it lighter. They all do this; all except one person. In the final picture, the group arrives at a huge chasm. Across it lies their true home. But there is no way across the chasm except for the one person who has left his cross intact. The heavy cross becomes a bridge to home that is able to bear the weight of its carrier because it is heavy and because it is long enough to span the distance between humanity and God.

As the Church in the modern world we are surrounded by a context that wants to pare down the cross or get rid of it completely because it doesn't know or believe in the chasm. It does not therefore see the need for the bridge of Jesus' cross. But we have the testimony of the life and death and resurrection of Jesus revealed in scripture, that not only will this bridge be needed, it will be essential. And we get to show that we ALL need the bridge and that Jesus is THE WAY.

We will not do this by getting angry at what has happened in the courts. We will not do this by arguing with people or circulating nasty emails. Resentment and bitterness never communicate hope. We WILL show that Jesus is the bridge by letting people know in word and action that we love them, that God loves them, and that the bridge is open to them. We do this as we show how Jesus has carried us across. We do this as we show that the only thing that has made us whole is the grace of Jesus Christ. We may be a tiny remnant; the only ones, holding on to the whole cross, but it is the cross that makes us whole. It is as we confidently and gracefully walk across this bridge that we best invite the world across the chasm.



### God's Faithfulness -

Lamentations 3: 22-23 - Because of the LORD's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness.

Over the last three quarters of a year, I've had the privilege of writing songs via Skype with another Christian that I met a few years ago at a retreat. This writing partnership has yielded some interesting discussions regarding theology and life. I very much appreciate the opportunity to sharpen my skills with another believer. Recently, our discussion has turned to the subject of God's faithfulness. In discussing this topic, I've begun to realize how faithless I can be. Anytime God's light shines on the dark corners of our lives, we get to learn how just and perfect He is and how lacking we are. I say this not to discourage, but to point up the juxtaposition and reality of our humanness and His divinity. Our very breath is dependent on God. He "gives and takes away" like the song says (Blessed Be Your Name).

God's faithfulness, fortunately, is not dependent on us. Though we might not acknowledge Him as we should, God still provides for our needs, regardless of our heart position. This is so convicting to me and urges me to do better. But overall, our faith is not dependent on ourselves and how we feel on a given day - thankfully! It really is a trust issue. Do we trust God is Who He says He is? Do we trust Him to handle our lives - the good times and the difficult times? Increasingly, my answer is YES! There was a time when I would panic when I had more month than money, or was concerned about a particular relationship that was having a rocky time. Now, giving it up to the Lord is both a relief and a blessing, because He knows all the details even before I ask for Him to take these things from me. I need to be faithful to "clear the decks" with Him regularly. And watch as He works my concerns out as part of His greater plan. Sometimes we don't see the fruit for a long time and sometimes we have more immediate answers. When I started learning to write songs - a long time ago - I didn't think there would ever be a song that was "good". As the Lord has led me deeper into this writing process and provided mentors and folks to write with, I am seeing some of the fruit of His labor in the songwriting.

Another writer, Thomas Obadiah Chisholm, who wrote the words to "Great is Thy Faithfulness", struggled in life. Chisholm was frequently bedridden with illness. When he was feeling well, he often had to work doubly hard in order to make ends meet. God was faithful to provide for his needs. Chisholm wrote poetry. His friend, William Runyan set the hymn to music. The lyric "Strength for today and bright hope for tomorrow" hints at Chisholm's need to lean into God's strength when he was ill. The refrain of the hymn comes directly from the Lamentations passage, above. A favorite of many, the song actually didn't get much notice after it was published in 1923. But after the Moody Bible Institute began using it in chapel services, it became better known. The hymn finally gained worldwide popularity when sung by George Beverly Shea at the Billy Graham crusade in 1945.

Another, more recent song speaks of God's faithfulness. "Help Me Find It", written by Ben McDonald, David Frey and Jason Ingram, talks about God never failing. The tone of surrender ("I will wait for You - come fill me up again; Have Your way my King - I give my all to You") is the corresponding action we are called to when we trust. To truly trust, we must surrender. That often means over and over. The second verse says: "I'm giving You fear and You give faith; I'm giving You doubt You give me grace; For every step I've never been alone. Even when it hurts You'll have Your way, Even in the valley I will say, With every breath You've never let me go".

God's faithfulness will never let us go. Our response is trust and surrender. God's plan will be worked with or without us. When we lean into His faithfulness and love; when we believe, trust Him and surrender, we gain His peace, joy and eternal life.

#### FINANCIAL PEACE UNIVERSITY

Hello FPC members. This is your fellow member, Robert Stansbury informing you of an opportunity to take a very exciting class, this fall, at our church. Financial Peace University is a biblically based course that has been taught for over 20 years and has helped over 4 million participants. The purpose of the course is to help people with their personal finances, budgeting and debt management. I will be the facilitator but I don't teach the course. The creator of the program, Dave Ramsey, is the teacher and DVD's are used each week as part of the classwork activities.

The cost is a little less than \$100 per couple or individual. Our class will meet every Monday evening from 7:00 to 8:30 p.m. in the Church Library for 9 straight weeks. We will start on September 21<sup>st</sup> and end on November 16<sup>th</sup>, which is a week before Thanksgiving. If you need financial assistance or babysitting, please let me know.
