From the Pastor's Workshop

"TELLING THE STORY"

I had something happen recently that caused me to realize how easily I take for granted the most essential thing in life. Here's what happened: One of my closest friends whom I have known since we were in Sunday school called and said, "I need a little direction. My pastor wants me to talk to a men's group about my faith story." I said, "Yeah, so?" He said, "So what do I tell them? How do you do this?" Two things came to mind: first, how infrequently we get asked to just come out and tell this story, and two, how *do* we do it? What do we say?" So I said, "Well, in your case it seems to me you would say something like, 'I got to live every boy's dream; I got to play in Yankee Stadium. I made it to the Major Leagues, but nothing, not even hitting 714 home runs compares to what it means to know what God did for me in Jesus Christ." He laughed and said, "Now you're going too far!" He was kidding. But isn't that like us to not realize that NOTHING that we could ever have or experience in this life will be greater than knowing the saving grace of Jesus Christ and what it means NOW as well as FOREVER?

Do you know how to tell your story of being found by the love of Jesus? Do you know how to explain in spontaneous words what this means for you on a day to day basis? Can you tell someone what it means that Jesus died for us? Keep it simple. Tell what that means for every day challenges. Tell the story of the hope this gives beyond this chapter.

I think often we get caught flat-footed on this because we don't really know how the reality of God's love for us exceeds all the things of this world. And I think this is because we try to compare God's love to things IN this world. There is no comparison, but that doesn't mean we can't know the reality of God's love. And interestingly we can know God's love because it IS greater than anything this world can offer. Yet even while we are here we can know it. It really is mysterious in this way. But that doesn't mean it isn't real. In fact, because God's love IS mysterious it is greater than the things in this world that we think are so concrete.

CS Lewis described this so well, I think, when he said,

Now Faith, in the sense in which I am here using the word, is the art of holding on to things your reason has once accepted, in spite of your changing moods. For moods will change, whatever view your reason takes. I know that by experience. Now that I am a Christian I do have moods in which the whole thing looks very improbable: but when I was an atheist I had moods in which Christianity looked terribly probable. This rebellion of your moods against your real self is going to come anyway. That is why Faith is such a necessary virtue: unless you teach your moods 'where they get off', you can never be either a sound Christian or even a sound atheist, but just a creature dithering to and fro, with its beliefs really dependent on the weather and the state of its digestion. Consequently one must train the habit of Faith.

The first step is to recognise the fact that your moods change. The next is to make sure that, if you have once accepted Christianity, then some of its main doctrines shall be deliberately held before your mind for some time every day. That is why daily prayers and religious readings and churchgoing are necessary parts of the Christian life. We have to be continually reminded of what we believe. Neither this belief nor any other will automatically remain alive in the mind. It must be fed. And as a matter of fact, if you examined a hundred

people who had lost their faith in Christianity, I wonder how many of them would turn out to have been reasoned out of it by honest argument? Do not most people simply drift away?

From Mere Christianity

His point is that telling the story comes from knowing THE story and how it claims us in our "lower" story. We become anchored to rather than drifting from THE story of God's love for us that came into this world to take us out and beyond this world as we live in the daily experience of telling "the old, old story of Jesus and his love." May this be the place in which we grow in our ability to do this for God's glory.

Maybe it starts with just inviting someone to church. Don't be surprised if they say yes and don't quit asking people if one person says no.

Dearest Church Family.




