From the Pastor's Workshop

"What if They Don't Know it's Christmas?"

As I have been preparing this, after a campaign fraught with bitterness and accusation; one that has polarized and filled our nation with angst, Donald J. Trump has been elected our 45th President. For some this is cause

for celebration and for others it is deeply disappointing. As followers of Jesus we are called to realize that God is sovereign in his perfect will and that our hope is ultimately only in his election. In times of sorrow and division we are called to "bear one another's burdens and so fulfill the law of Christ." (Galatians 6:2) We are called to "weep with those who weep" (Romans 12:15) and "as much as it depends on you [us] live peaceably with one another." (Romans 12:18). We need to show empathy to one another in the name of Jesus so that he may bind us together as a nation and as



the body of Christ. Only as we live this way will we find the way forward to which Jesus leads; and that way is to the manger. But what if people don't know the way?

I want you to think about something with me. What if you discovered that as the days of the Christmas Advent season came upon us, every time you said to someone, "Merry Christmas" you were met with a blank stare. What if every face had a look of puzzlement; not resistance or resentment, but a look that said, "I'd LIKE to know what your joyful greeting is about, but I don't. Could you tell me?"

I want us to think about this because I think we are in a time when this is the case. Oh, I know people might THINK they know what Christmas is. Or people might have some warm fuzzy recollection of eggnog or Santa or chestnuts roasting on an open fire, but I think many if not the majority of people do not really know what Christmas is about.

Do WE know the central point of Christmas? I think it gets easily buried today because our culture seems to be at a low point in terms of personal responsibility. The idea of saying, "I did that. I broke it. I didn't follow through. I didn't keep my promise" just doesn't seem to be lived out much. But in Christmas we see the ultimate example. God took responsibility for his creation. When we failed; when we ran away; when we broke what God had made perfect God stepped in to redeem and make over. He did this with his own Son.

Christmas is an amazing time to be telling this story to people who don't know and they aren't hard to find. Ours is the opportunity to tell why we say, "Merry Christmas". How? Be creative. Sing along to the carols in line at the store. (Not every tune is "Here Comes Santa Claus, you know!) So KNOW the words. The theology of the carols may be our best telling of the Gospel in Christmas music. Be subversive. Include the poem, "One Solitary Life" with the cookies you give or in the card you send. Decide to be filled

with the joy of God taking responsibility for you. Let it show. Choose to NOT be too busy or bogged down in these days. Let the light of God's greatest gift lead you to KNOW why Christmas is God's greatest gift.

There will be lots of ways to invite people to know it is Christmas around here: Worship and the great music of the season, the children's Christmas Pageant, the Advent Workshop, the Ring and Sing potluck and concert, The First Presbyterian LIFT Christmas Tree Lot where you can volunteer or send your friends to get their Christmas Tree; there are so many ways to let people know it's Christmas. Let's not miss one.

KING'S KIDS BIBLE EXPERIENCE:

We have been walking with the Israelites through their exodus from Egypt and the beginnings of their wilderness wandering. We have seen how GOD has been faithful throughout their experiences.

As we enter into Advent, we're learning the shema, the ancient blessing: "Hear O Israel. The Lord is our God. The Lord is One. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your mind and with all your strength." We're looking at how each of the people in the nativity story loved God is this way, and in how WE can love God with all OUR heart, mind and strength.



ANCHORED IN CHRIST-

This time of year, it is not uncommon to have storms cross the Sierra and dump precipitation in one form or another. As the storm approaches, there is most often wind of a gusty quality that can be very destructive as it tosses items that are not tied down.

In some ways, this could very well be a picture of where we find ourselves at this moment, both as God's people and as His people living in the USA. Ephesians 4:2 challenges us to "Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love." Even though Paul is speaking to the Body of Christ, there are those that are watching us as the Body of Christ to see how we react to the events occurring in the world and in our nation. It would be really easy to stir up a lot of dust that makes it hard to see what really matters. The more prudent course, in my mind, is to point to Jesus in how we live and love others.

Further in Ephesians, Paul challenges us to be mature Christians - vs. 14 "Then we will no longer be infants, tossed back and forth by the waves, and blown here and there by every wind of teaching and by the cunning and craftiness of people in their deceitful scheming. 15. Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of him who is the head, that is Christ." And 17. "So I tell you this, and insist on it in the Lord, that you must no longer live as the Gentiles do, in the futility of their thinking. 18. They are darkened in their understanding and separated from the life of God because of the ignorance that is in them due to the hardening of their hearts."

We are called to be anchored in Christ, not in the world. No matter what our circumstance may be. We are told to put off the old self (our old ways of doing and living) and be made new in the attitudes of our minds (vs. 22-23). As Paul admonishes the Ephesians, let us also "rid ourselves of bitterness, anger, rage, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice." If we are of The Way, let us be a humble, patient, gentle, and loving example to others who need The Way, for Christ came that all might believe in Him and live.




