From the Pastor's Workshop

#### "Growing Fruit"

I am a road trip junkie. I resonate with these opening words of John Steinbeck from my favorite book, <u>Travels</u> with Charley.

When I was very young and the urge to be someplace else was on me, I was assured by mature people that maturity would cure this itch. When years described me as mature, the remedy prescribed was middle age. In middle age I was assured that greater age would calm my fever and now that I am fifty-eight perhaps senility will do the job.

I have always loved the call of the road. I love to go get lost on my motorcycle with no place to necessarily be and with no time schedule. But there was a time when my longest road trips were on four wheels driving coast to coast twice a year for three years in seminary. And like Steinbeck I had a big, wonderful dog with me, "Casey the Frisbeterian" the kids called him at Princeton. Casey and I loved listening to the radio as we drove; a lot of country songs and one we liked best talked about the two things in life that money can't buy: real true love and homegrown tomatoes. I'm not talking about those waxy things that might look like a tomato but have been strip-mined in some green house. I'm talkin' real, homegrown, sweet to the core, lovingly raised in the yard of love tomatoes. See, looking like and BEING real are two very different things.



It is spring time and that means time to start growing things again. It is also a time to remember real true love. Nancy and I celebrate 40 years of marriage this month. But we've known each other nearly 45. We started dating as teenagers and love grew like homegrown tomatoes.

God's love for us is real and true. And we know it as we nurture the seed he has planted in us. Nancy and I cherish what God has given us to grow in our lives. Half of our 40 years has been right here. 27 of those years God has given us the opportunity to be part of growing a "yellow rose" he gave us in Texas; Kate. And what we have learned is that for the richness and the sweetness of God's love to grow in us and through us is that we need to be nurturing this love. We are learning how important it is for us to be planted in his word, in great books about trusting him, in relationships with people who encourage and mentor us in our faith, to be deeply committed to prayer so that we are going the way Jesus calls us.

How about you? Do you love fresh produce and sweet fruit? Who doesn't? We will only know this as we commit ourselves to tending what God has given us in relationship with Jesus Christ. We need to spend time in the "soil" with God's Holy Spirit turning over the rocks in our lives. Sometimes this means taking a "road trip" with Jesus; getting away from our routines that have NOT left time for the growing God has in mind for us.



#### The Gift of Humility -

Years ago, when I attended college, I had a picture in my imagination of where I thought my life was headed. In that picture, I was a concert performer, receiving adulation for my interpretation of the piano masters' music. Fame, fortune and whatever came along with that. What a rude awakening to be told that I wasn't good enough to do that when the music school put me in the program they thought would fit my skills. At that point, I was grateful to be in the music program at all. And probably in the back of my head, I thought, well I'll just work really hard and learn as much as I can so that I can prove them wrong. While the work was not a bad thing, perhaps my way of going about the task at hand was not the most helpful. You see, I had left God out of my equation. Interestingly, though, He was still there. Especially at my senior recital. I remember praying over that event fervently!

Fast forward to graduation from college. I should mention that after graduating, my mother, who from time to time has been prophetic in her musings, stated that I should look for a church that needed a music person. What mom knew, and I kept denying was that I needed to be in communion with God. At the time my mother indicated her thoughts on my career, I was about as far away from being a church-goer as one could possibly be. I dismissed her advice and followed my merry path.

About three years after graduation, I got married and had three children over the period of about six years. My husband, also a musician, seemed threatened by whatever musical skills I displayed, while not actually coming out and saying that. Somehow, in order to "keep the peace", I decided that moving away from music, formerly my lifeblood, was a wise move. Besides, I didn't have much time except for work and taking care of children. So, it just seemed easier and less conflicting to leave the music behind.

But God -- which always is a surprise to me, had not forgotten about my training and as my family weathered a huge loss in the illness and death of my son, and subsequently the death of the marriage, my girls and I returned to church. For awhile we attended a Calvary Chapel, but we eventually made our way back to the Presbyterian church. Slowly, through participating in the choir, praise team, and playing as a substitute periodically, I came to see that the music gift the Lord had given me was to be used for Him. Overall, it took about twenty years, from graduation until I began serving in the church, for me to recognize the wisdom of serving God over the concert life I had imagined for myself. And through the process of participating in church music, I began to understand the need for me to be humbled before I could serve.

This journey has not been an easy one, but it has been more rewarding than the empty adulation of public performance. The goal of our musical offerings in church is to glorify God and not ourselves. *He must increase and I must decrease* ----to paraphrase John 3:30.

Thank you for allowing me to attend a music writing seminar and the West Coast Pastors' Conference these last ten days. I've come to realize that any success any of us ever has in this life is a gift from God. Any promotion that happens needs to come through God. So, in humility, I need to take what God has given me and offer it back to Him in a way that points to Him and glorifies Him. Each one of us has been gifted by God and called in our own uniqueness to serve Him. Even when it feels like nothing is happening on the journey, we can be sure that God is protecting us and preparing the path ahead for us. What does your gift of humility look like?


#### **UPCOMING BELIZE MISSION TRIP**
