From the Pastor's Workshop

"GETTING TO SERVE"

Dr. Bruce Metzger headed the translation of the Revised Standard Version and the New Revised Standard Version of the Bible. He was renowned as one of the greatest scholars of biblical languages in the 20th century. I had him for one of the last classes he taught. He expected a lot of us, but he expected a lot of himself because he knew we were to be servants of the ONE who came to serve. His favorite verse of Mark 10:45, "For the Son of Man, [the Messiah, the Savior] came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many."

By example Dr. Metzger showed us that this is to be reflected in our lives. We are to be servants to the King who gave his life that we may have life forever and that we may know this by giving our lives to him so that others may know the love he came to give as a ransom. The thing I learned from Dr. Metzger is something I have

learned from many of you: before we HAVE to do this, we GET to do this. We get to serve so that people may know Jesus. And they will know Jesus because of the joy with which we live this life and love people in Jesus' name.

What does "getting to serve" look like? It looks like people finding a place in this part (or any part) of Christ's body and stepping up again and again to help people know Jesus Christ. Getting to serve is actively seeking a place that needs to be filled: regular welcoming greeters are needed each Sunday; people who will show people where the nursery is, help them find a seat, a place, where the restrooms are. Those who serve in this way seek out those who arrive late; who are new; who have a question or just need someone to smile and say, "We are so glad you are here." I know Dave Berger does this every week, and informally so do many of us, but we are growing! There are more new people coming through the doors every week. We need people who say, "I get to be a greeter!"

As we roll into fall we need those who say, "I GET to teach Sunday school, I get to sing in the choir, I get to be a deacon or an elder, I get to help with youth group, I get to usher, I get to paint the doors and spruce up the outside of the old sanctuary, I get to help with the newsletter, I get to help in the office, I get to invite my neighbor to worship, I get to go to Bible study or prayer group. I GET to be part of this church. Which of these "Get to's" is yours? Certainly there are a lot more I haven't mentioned. You see, none of this is busy work. ALL of it plays a part in leading people to know and serve Jesus Christ and NOTHING is more important in this life than this. When it is all over and probably long before, we will all realize that the "get to" things mean so much more than things we have on our list that really don't matter. I need to pare my list down so there is room for what God knows I get to do if I will just let myself.

If you don't have a "get to" my prayer is that you would ask God to encourage you to seek one out, because as we live into our "get to" part of life we share and show the joy of belonging to Jesus. And joy is the way to lead people home to him. May we all find a "get to" this season. As we do this may we realize that someone's life is changed because we chose to serve Jesus joyfully.


