From the Pastor's Workshop

"The Mission"

Do you ever take inventory of your life? When I was in the motorcycle business we had to take inventory twice a year. It was tedious. "How many nuts and bolts in this box?" "Looks like about 137 to me." No one wanted to count the little stuff. But how about the "little stuff" in our lives? Do we stop to "take inventory" of our prayer lives or our Bible reading? I know this isn't little, but who would know? The answer is, "We will" if we are not paying attention to what we are leaving out of our lives.

Throughout this year your pastors and session have been taking inventory of how God is calling us to be his Church and to carry out his mission. This has led us, as you know, to seek to move into a "room in God's house" that will more effectively enable us to do THE mission of leading people to know and serve Jesus Christ. In this "new room" there is space for <u>all</u> who hear God's Holy Spirit calling them to be embraced by the redeeming work that Jesus alone can do. It is a space that unambiguously belongs to Jesus. It is a setting that will honor his calling to be doing his mission. This space is called *ECO: A Covenant Order of Evangelical Presbyterians.* "Evangelical" simply means "the mission of Good News in Jesus Christ". On September 17, The Nevada Presbytery voted to dismiss our congregation to ECO and to allow me to remain in the Board of Pensions of the PCUSA for health care and pension purposes through to retirement. This is a "win" for the kingdom of God. On October 19 we will have ONE SERVICE at 10 AM followed by a congregational meeting where we will vote to ratify the Presbytery's action. You have received the details of this action. They are also available in the church office and on our website at fpccarsoncity.org.

It will be necessary for at least 50% of the congregation to be present at this meeting and for 85% to vote in support of this action. My prayer is that we would be present and support this way beyond either of these percentages. If you have ANY questions about this action and the meeting, PLEASE know that I am VERY willing to discuss this with you. We want all to understand it and to be able to joyfully enter this new space together.

This is key to fulfilling our mission as God's people. If we have left out prayer, worship, Bible reading and study, and being still to listen to God's direction we will not be at the disposal of the Holy Spirit. We not only won't know the mission; we won't be able to carry it out because we don't have the message or the direction.

Fall is a great time to take stock and this fall we are focusing on the reasonableness of our Christian faith. When we do this we will be best equipped to tell the world about the uniqueness of Jesus. Part of taking stock is reflecting on who he is and what he has done. This enables us to know rationally that Jesus' claims are ones that are compelling to us and through us.

Pascal once said, "Faith has reasons of which reason knows not." This is to say that our minds can only take us so far, but God has given us great minds that allow us to access the faith he offers so that we may know him. And as a result of knowing God we can make known the salvation and redemption Jesus alone makes known. This is like being able to tell a starving person how to find the only place there is food.

None of us needs to be embarrassed to do this, but we may not know how. This season we will be focusing on this in worship and reflecting on it in our Wednesday Bible studies as we gather for a video based series called "Defending the Faith." This is a great place to bring people who do not know about Christianity, but it is also a great learning time for all of us on why our Christian faith is the believable gift that it is.

I hope you will join us this fall as we grow in knowing our mission to make known Jesus our Lord.

MOVING FROM PCUSA TO ECO AND BEYOND

The Presbytery of Nevada's vote to approve the terms of dismissal that our session and the Presbytery's negotiating team developed together was a huge and important step for our congregation's future, but it is not the entire journey. I believe that God is clearing the way for us to experience a new *re-formation* at the hands of the Holy Spirit. Belonging to Jesus is a wild, paradoxical kind of experience. We *have been* saved and adopted as children of God, and yet we are still *being transformed* into Christ's likeness – **already** but **not yet**. I am convinced that membership in ECO: A Covenant Order of Presbyterians is the best next step for us as we seek to be faithful.

I do not think it is constructive for us to dwell on the way that things are going in the PCUSA. We cannot be a church defined and motivated by what we are against. We have to put all our energy into what we are for—the Gospel of Jesus Christ. On Sunday, October 19th, we will have a single worship service and then a called Congregational Meeting to vote on the dismissal. I am asking you to attend this meeting not as a final step in the dismissal process but as a first step into a new future of transformation and faith.

We have to be a church that exists to bring the light of the gospel to the world. This means we must call on the Holy Spirit to help us fight to be faithful. And by fight, I do **not** mean polity struggles; I mean against the power of the evil one and our own self-centeredness. It is not in our nature to exist to serve others! We are not predisposed to love people the way that Christ loves the world! But the power that we have seen in the cross and the resurrection of Jesus is also at work within us.

What will the future look like? What will the next steps be? I do not know. In ECO, we will join a "Mission Affinity Group" (MAG) with other churches to help us reflect on our calling and the shape of our local community. Each MAG meeting will be an opportunity for people in our church – formal leadership and anyone who wants to step up – to get involved in theological and practical discussions about moving forward in serving Jesus. It is my hope that our MAG and other initiatives in ECO will help guide us into a new chapter.

As we celebrate "Light the Night with Jesus", kids are encouraged to come dressed in a BIBLE costume. (This can be as simple as a bathrobe & prop, or much more detailed – just have FUN with it!)

Uncertainty-

Proverbs 3: 5 Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; 6 in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight.

One of the things I've realized most recently is that uncertainty is a gift. Uncertainty viewed from the outside, looks like a nuisance and a burden. From the inside, I can tell you that the gift of uncertainty is that it makes me lean on God. It pulls me back to where I should be all the time, relying on Him. Uncertainty in my life requires me to let go of everything that commands my attention, but is really a distraction from my real purpose of concentrating my faith in the Lord. Uncertainty in my life strips away my ability to control anything and makes it necessary for me to listen for His leading.

Allow me to explain: If I have no doubt and I am operating in my own counsel or relying on my own ideas to make something happen, I am blind at best and heading for disaster at worst. God gives me the gift of uncertainty by allowing situations in my life to be off-kilter, unpredictable, or changing -- certainly not something I naturally want because in my humanness I am dedicated to comfort, predictability and knowing that my life goes on from day to day in much the same reliable way. But if I can explain and expect the life situations to come, then I'm not really relying on God, am I? I am still operating in my own power and not looking to God to lead me. So that is the gift of which I speak.

Singer/songwriter Tim Timmons has a unique gift of putting these thoughts into songs. Twelve years ago he was diagnosed with an incurable cancer and given five years to live. Somewhere in the midst of this devastating diagnosis, he realized that, though he'd been a Christian all his life, he suspected that the way he had been living life looked like he had been asking Jesus to bless Tim's efforts instead of asking Jesus to lead and show him how to follow. In his song, "Cast My Cares" he challenges us to give over all uncertainty and doubt to Christ and let Him show us His way of doing life.

In the middle of the night, when worry finds me, in the middle of a fight, when strength is gone, in the middle of a fire, when fear is closing in, You are, You are my song. You're my hope when hope is gone.

I will cast my cares on You, the Almighty. I will cast my cares on You, 'cause You're good.

I will cast my cares on You, 'cause You love me, You love me. Oh, oh, because You love me.

God of glory, You are able through Your power to be faithful. God of mercy, ev'ry moment, You are near to me. In the middle of the night, I'll pray with confidence. In the middle of a fight, You're greater still.

In the middle of a fire, Your love is holding me. You are, You are my song. You're my hope when hope is gone.

There is an older song, written by the prolific hymnodist Fanny Crosby, that speaks of letting Jesus lead us in all things -- especially in the face of uncertainty. The song, "All the Way My Savior Leads Me" was written in response to an uncertainty in her life. Fanny, blind from the time she was 6 weeks old, relied on her Lord and Savior for everything. It is said that Fanny Crosby found herself needing \$5.00 one day and not knowing how to obtain it, began praying about the situation. Within a few minutes a stranger appeared at her door with just the right amount. Fanny had no way to account for this but to attribute it to God hearing her prayer and acting upon it. In her gratitude, she penned the words to the hymn, "All the Way My Savior Leads Me".
