From the Pastor's Workshop

"Who Will We Bring to the Manger?"

It's already December! Once more Advent and Christmas are upon us. Does it ever feel to you like time moves in such a way that everything flows together without boundaries? For me, I need distinction, particularly at Christmas. I want to say to the all the other stuff of life what I see on some emails: "I will be out of the office from December 1-25. If you need me I will be in Bethlehem. Please know that you are invited to join me there. I will be at the manger just behind the Inn with the "no vacancy" sign."

I say this because the significance of Advent is something there is NEVER enough time to ponder, but when we make the time, I believe all of life comes together. When we start to realize what it means that God came to earth in human form and why he did, a lot of questions about our entire existence are either answered or they disappear in the light of what God did.

Because this is so I need more time to think about it and pray about it and sing about it and let a lot of other stuff just fall away. And when I do it makes me want to tell other people and invite them to ponder with me who Jesus is and why he came and what it means for the world.

You see, Jesus came because we are a lost people trying to find political, social, spiritual, and economic hope. And he came to step into our darkness and questioning to BE the answer. "That's what Christmas is all about Charlie Brown" to borrow Linus' great line.

But what if people don't know this? I've found over the years I've been in plenty of discussions that are not very helpful in talking about God largely because there is not enough time simply listening to who Jesus is. And THAT is why I've found the best place to go is to the manger and simply say, "There he is. Look for yourself." Who do you think he is? And when ANY of us will do this; I mean REALLY listen to Jesus and consider him all of life starts to look VERY different.

Who do you know that needs to come to the manger? How far is it to Bethlehem? Not as far as we think. It is really just that one step away from the old life and toward letting Jesus show himself to us. It is the one step toward someone we know, taking them by the arm and the heart and saying, "Come with me for a little while. There's something I know you will want to see."

And where is the manger? Right here, where God's people gather to worship and pray and sing and ponder about God coming in the flesh to make all things new. This month we have developed some invitations for you to use to invite people. I call them "Directions to the Manger". You can pick them up at church or the office and use them to show people the way to the place that will answer questions they have been asking and didn't even know it. I hope you will use lots of them because there are lots of people who need to be "at the manger".

May this be the most blessed and pondering Advent of your entire life.



Worship - Our Biblical Mandate

"Sing to the Lord, you saints of his; praise his holy name" (Psalm 30:4)

"Sing psalms, hymns and spiritual songs with gratitude in your hearts to God" (Colossians 3:16)

"Praise him with tambourine and dancing, praise him with the strings and flute, praise him with the clash of cymbals" (Psalm 150:4-5)

Worship music is not the warm-up for anything. Worship is the central activity of God's people. We are commanded to gather and worship God using song, (Ps. 149:1 and 1 Thess 5:17). Song is not the only way we worship God, however. There are personal devotions, prayer, preaching or testimony and doing things for others. We are called to use our whole lives to declare God's "worth-ship" (remember that is where the word "worship" comes from). We need to get better at this, for we will be doing it in His presence for eternity when Christ returns for His church.

It is easy to worship when everything is going well in our lives. But when things are not going well, its can be much more difficult to worship. The way to get through the roadblock is to focus our eyes on Him and let everything else fall away as we worship. We are called to dedicate our whole lives to God -- making our worship one of complete devotion to Him, in the same way we are called to use our whole bodies in worship:

Whether we physically stand, bow down, kneel, raise our hands or become prostrate on the floor, how do you show these acts of worship? (Psalm 95:6, Psalm 63:4, Ezra 9: 5-6, 2 Chron. 20:18, Luke 22:4)

Whether we treat others as we would like to be treated; we do an act of kindness for a stranger, or our neighbor, or our family member -- how do you show your devotion to God? (John 4:23, Eph. 2:10, Romans 12:1-2)

Whether we speak truth in love -- honestly, or gracefully speak into another's life in such a way we don't hurt the person we are speaking with, or sing our adoration to God, or watch our language, or soften or harden our tone of voice -- how do you show Jesus what the content of your heart is? (Psalm 39:1, Matthew 12:34 and Matthew 15:11)

Our thoughts are inseparable from our bodies -- even though they aren't necessarily part of our bodies. How do YOU take every thought captive to Christ -- including the thoughts you have about yourself! Ask yourself: "Am I thinking the way the world thinks -- or the way Christ thinks?" (Psalm 10:4 and 2 Cor.10:5)

Let's ask God every day, and especially when we are in worship, to guide and direct our thoughts and actions so that they are pleasing to Him. Let's also bend the knees He made and lift the hands He made to worship Him in private and/or in public. Let's lift the voices He made to praise Him and finally, (and especially), let us lift our hearts to the Lord, for He is our Maker, our Provider, our Savior and our Deliverer.

One day I will be asked what I have done for The Lord, and I do not want to make excuses for holding myself back in expressing my devotion to God out of fear of what someone might have thought of me. Indeed, I have no defense! The <u>only</u> thing that is important in this life and the next is what God through Christ and the Holy Spirit has done for me and for countless others! As we come into this Advent season, I pray we will all remember the single focus of worship and that God sent His Son specifically for each us, and for all, that no one might be lost. This rescue that God gives is worth everything!



- The Christ Candle is lit on Christmas Eve, December 24th.

NEWS FROM BUILDING & GROUNDS

It's that time of the year, when leaves turn, temperatures drop and our utility bills here at the Church take a turn UPWARDS! While it is something which happens every year we are passing on a few tips which will help us stay within our budgeted utility usage. They include:

- 1) Please close any windows you might open during a meeting or function.
- All doors should be closed in the Church when not in use. This has been an issue not quickly accepted but is part of the State Fire Marshall Code for our building.
- 3) Turn the temperature down when leaving. Also if you can hold your meeting 3-4 degrees cooler than usual that would be very helpful.
- 4) Turn OFF all lights when leaving.

One of the most surprising utility changes has been the hefty water & sewer increase. Our city decided to make up for lost revenue over the years. They have re-classified us to commercial non-occupied as we do not have a person residing on the premises. We will now be seeing water and sewage bills which are nearly 3 times what they were

As this is a fixed line item in our budget, we can and have plugged in money to handle it. However, it also puts a dent in the increase of our fixed costs. Should you encounter any water waste, no matter what time of the day, please give Ken Pearson (775-721-7373) or Dennie Young (775-671-7974) a call ASAP. Lawn sprinklers will be looked at for savings to help reduce additional costs.

I would like to thank each of you for your support and watchful eye on utility usage. I would like to assure you we will do everything possible to reduce problems which might promote additional costs in this area.
