- 1. Face to Face: An intimate companion that knows us better than anyone.
- 2. Shoulder to Shoulder: A co-laborer working together toward the great common goal.
- 3. Back to Back: An ally, fighting the same fight against the real enemy.

#### I. Face to Face

- Where are we going?
- What are you dreaming about?
- What are you afraid of?
- Where do you see God at work?

"To be loved but not known is comforting but superficial. To be known and not loved is our greatest fear. But to be fully known and truly loved is, well, a lot like being loved by God."

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#### 15 Minutes Face to Face

- 1. One person stand on a chair and the other sit. Now the standing person tell the sitting person one thing that I just shared that really stood out to them.
- 2. Now sit back to back, the other person share one thing that I shared about the first strand in the steal cable of the mission of marriage with them.

#### 15 Minutes Face to Face

3. Now turn face to face, hold hands and look into the eyes. This is the posture of true intimacy. This is the posture of conflict resolution. How difficult would it be to be angry with your spouse and yell at them from this posture? What about the others? Take 5 minutes and intentionally consider the importance of presence and the one thing that stood out to you in this lesson.


