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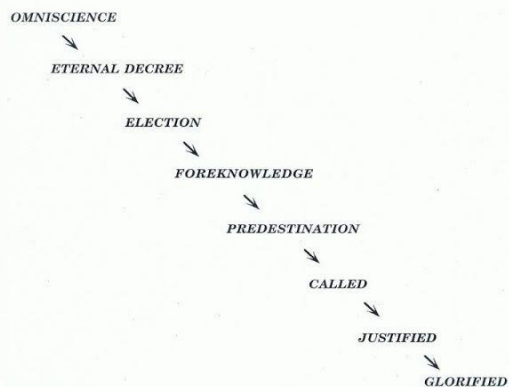
VI. God's purpose therefore in saving you is so that you might praise the Son forever.

The Glory of God

1. From the beginning to end, the driving impulse of God's heart is to be praised for His glory.
2. From creation to judgment His allegiance is to Himself.
3. His unwavering purpose in all He does is to exalt the honor of His name.
4. He is infinitely jealous for His reputation.

Isa. 48:11

For My own sake, for My own sake, I will act;
For how can My name be profaned?
And My glory I will not give to another.

5. God loves Himself more than He loves me.
6. **A MAN'S LIFE IS NOT GREATER THAN THE GLORY OF GOD!**

Is It Wrong for God to Want to Be Glorified?

1. God has a passion for His glory.
He loves perfection and it being displayed.
Do you love perfection?
Do you love to see it displayed?
2. Three things we do with perfection:
 1. Display it.
 2. Praise it.
 3. Enjoy it.

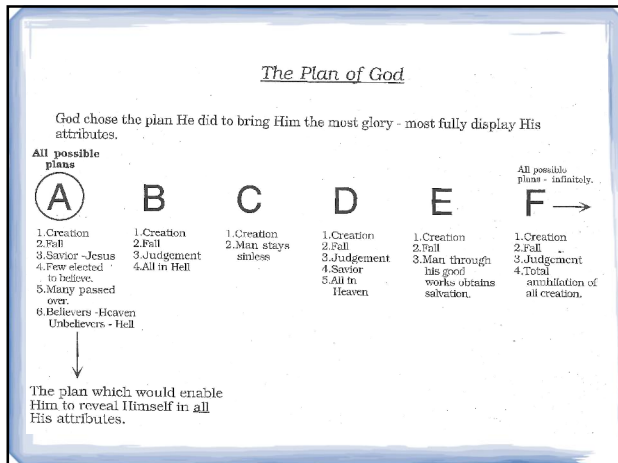

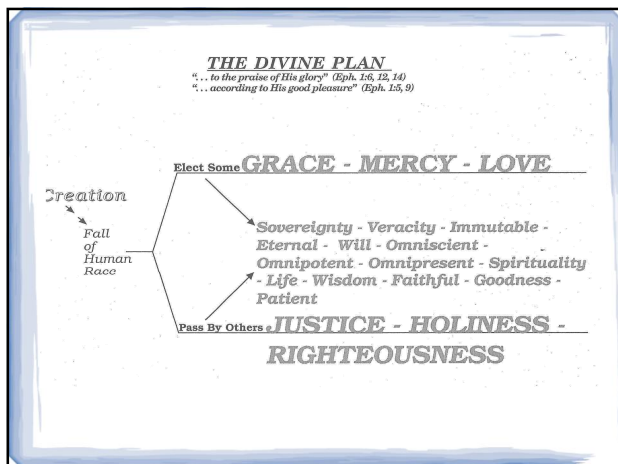

3. **We cannot add to God's glory**, we can only magnify it. Intrinsically God has glory . like the sun has light, the sky has blue, and water has wet.
4. Compared to God, anything I am is so far inferior to what God is like, that to glorify myself, is to be self-centered, which is a sin - it is undeserved glory. Man knows down deep that self-centeredness is wrong. A self-centered, self-glorifying person is blind and self-deceived.
5. God, seeking to glorify Himself, is deserved glory. He is the highest (~~Most High~~) and absolutely most perfect Being in the universe. **His glory is deserving of being magnified.**







The Inability of Spiritually Dead Man

1. Man is DEAD (spiritually) in his sin. **Eph. 2: 1-5:**
 1. And **you were dead in your trespasses and sins.**
 2. in which you formerly walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, of the spirit that is now working in the sons of disobedience.
 3. Among them **we too all formerly lived in the lusts of our flesh, indulging the desires of the flesh and of the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, even as the rest.**
 4. **But God**, being rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us,
 5. even when we were dead in our transgressions, **made us alive** together with Christ (by grace have you been saved).

Col. 2:13
 When **you were dead in your transgressions** and the uncircumcision of your flesh, **He made you alive** together with Him, having forgiven us all our transgressions.

2. This is where the whole crux of the issue lies.

WHAT IS MAN CAPABLE OF? IS HE 99% GONE? CAN HE STILL OPEN HIS MOUTH WHEN THE SPOON OF MEDICINE IS PUT TO HIS LIPS? IS HE GASPING? OR AS THE SCRIPTURE SAYS – IS HE DEAD?

HOW YOU ANSWER THIS QUESTION IS CRITICAL TO YOUR UNDERSTANDING OF ELECTION.

3. Every man arrives in this world DOA . Dead On Arrival.

HE EXHIBITS THE CHARACTERISTICS OF DEPRAVITY. HE IS NOT 100% DEPRAVED IN ALL AREAS OF HIS LIFE, BUT EVERY AREA, TO SOME DEGREE, IS AFFECTED BY HIS DEPRAVED CONDITION.

4. The resurrection of Lazarus was not a joint effort between Christ and Lazarus.

LAZARUS CAME FORTH BECAUSE HE WAS RAISED, NOT IN ORDER TO BE RAISED.

5. Man's inability means he is incapable of seeking God on his own.

Rom. 3:11 There is none who seeks for God;

(%Seeker sensitive+concept is inaccurate for this reason.)

IF MAN IS LEFT ALONE IN THIS STATE, HE WILL GET WHAT HE DESERVES . JUSTICE. HE WILL EXPERIENCE THE WRATH AND CONDEMNATION OF GOD. HE IS HELPLESS TO CHANGE HIS SPIRITUAL CONDITION. **HE CANNOT SAVE HIMSELF.**
