The Disciples' Faulty Eschatology

Mark 9:9-10 As they were coming down from the mountain, He gave them orders **not to relate to anyone** what they had seen, until the Son of Man rose from the dead. They seized upon that statement, discussing with one another what rising from the dead meant.

<u>John 11:24</u> Martha said to Him, "I know that he will rise again in the resurrection on the last day."

The Disciples Expectations

Mark 9:11 They asked Him, saying, "Why is it that the scribes say that Elijah must come first?"

- 1. Elijah comes
- 2. Messiah comes with resurrection + kingdom

Jesus Challenges Their Assumptions


Mark 9:12 And He said to them, "Elijah does first come and restore all things. And yet how is it written of the Son of Man that He will suffer many things and be treated with contempt?"

- 1. "on the one hand...on the other..."
- 2. Yes Malachi 4:6 will be fulfilled, but so will Isaiah 53:3!

Elijah To Restore All Things?

Malachi 4:5 Behold, I am going to send you Elijah the prophet **before** the coming of the great and terrible day of the Lord.



Elijah To Restore All Things?

Malachi 4:6 He will restore the hearts of the fathers to their children and the hearts of the children to their fathers, so that I will not come and smite the land with a curse.

Malachi 2:10 Do we not all have one father?
Has not one God created us? Why do we
deal treacherously each against his brother
so as to profane the covenant of our fathers?

Summary Of Elijah's Coming

- 1. Elijah's first coming: Beginning of restoration Luke 2:34b "Behold, this Child is appointed for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and for a sign to be opposed..."
- 2. Elijah's second coming: Consummation of restoration

Romans 11:26 and so all Israel will be saved: just as it is written, "The Deliverer will come from Zion, He will remove ungodliness from Jacob."

John The Baptist As Elijah

Mark 9:13 But I say to you that Elijah has indeed come, and they did to him whatever they wished, just as it is written of him.

Elijah = abused by wicked woman + weak king John = abused by wicked woman + weak king

Application

- 1. We must learn from the disciples' mistake: Jesus must first atone for our sins if we our to have a share in His glory.
- 2. Elijah's "restoration of all things" reminds us that God is not done with the nation of Israel.
- 3. Elijah's ministry reminds us that suffering is God's refinement of His people.
