A Circumcision Made Without Hands

Colossians 2:11a (ESV)

In him also you were circumcised with a circumcision made without hands

- Colossians 2:10a = "you have been filled in Him"
- "In Whom" begins this verse and describes being complete in Christ
- "without hands" denotes a spiritual circumcision, that of the heart
- This is taught in Romans 2:28, 29

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The Circumcision of Christ

Colossians 2:11b (ESV)

by putting off the body of the flesh, by the circumcision of Christ

- This denotes the "putting off of" that which is ruled by our fallen sinfulness (Romans 6:6)
- Christ is the One who does the circumcision of the heart (possessive genitive)
- The circumcision is done by Christ as He separates believers from the world of sin and death



he Circumcised Heart: Colossians 2:11, 12

Buried and Raised With Christ by Faith

Colossians 2:12 (ESV)

having been buried with him in baptism, in which you were also raised with him through faith in the powerful working of God, who raised him from the dead.

• Only the dead are buried!

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- Buried and raised are divine passives (i.e., by God)
- In baptism we by faith spiritually participate in Christ's death, burial and resurrection

Three Divine Passives

- "Circumcised"
- "Buried together"
- "Raised together"

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This shows the solidarity of believers with Christ.

We do not need what the false teachers offer.

Implications and Applications

- The circumcision of the heart was promised in the OT and fulfilled in Christ
- We need to take seriously the implications of our baptism
- There is no justification for infant baptism in this passage
- Beware false assurance from infant baptism



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The Promise of the Circumcised Heart

Deuteronomy 30:6 (NASB)

Moreover the Lord your God will circumcise your heart and the heart of your descendants, to love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul, so that you may live.

- This is a description of regeneration
- Ezekiel 36:26, 27
- Philippians 3:3

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Important Implications of Baptism

Romans 6:3-4 (NASB)

Or do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus have been baptized into His death? Therefore we have been buried with Him through baptism into death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life.

- Baptism is a physical act with spiritual implications
- Baptism is by immersion
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Colossians 2:11, 12 Do Not Teach or Imply Infant Baptism

- Infant baptism could not have applied to anyone in Colossae reading Paul's letter
- Circumcision is spiritual (of the heart) and does not denote infant baptism which would be physical
- Infant baptism does not replace physical circumcision as a sign of entrance into the covenant
- One must be born again to enter the New Covenant (Jeremiah 31:31-34) Baptized infants are not thereby regenerate

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Avoid False Assurance

1Corinthians 10:1, 2, 5 (NASB)

For I do not want you to be unaware, brethren, that our fathers were all under the cloud and all passed through the sea; and all were baptized into Moses in the cloud and in the sea; . . . nevertheless, with most of them God was not well-pleased; for they were laid low in the wilderness.

- Idolaters are lost whether baptized or not
- We are only raised to newness of life by faith in God's powerful working

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
