Whatever you do, do your work heartily, as for the Lord rather than for men

- "Whatever you do" is literal and comprehensive
- In the Greek it says "from the soul" (heartily)
- Men are unjust but God is always perfectly just
- For the Christian, nothing is truly mundane
- "Work" is imperative in the Greek

because you know that you will receive your inheritance from the Lord as the reward. Serve the Lord Christ

- "Serve" is imperative in the Greek
- Knowing the truth about eternal justice gives present motivation
- Even if we have no inheritance in this life, we have an eternal one

God Is Impartial

Colossians 3:25 (NASB)

For he who does wrong will receive the consequences of the wrong which he has done, and that without partiality.

- This truth applies to all, in context: slaves and slave owners
- Judgment is eternal and includes actions
- The wrong-doer will bear the results of his own actions
- God is not impressed by worldly status

Christian Masters Are to Be Equitable

Colossians 4:1 (NASB)

Masters, grant to your slaves justice and fairness, knowing that you too have a Master in heaven.

- We all have a Master in heaven
- "Grant" is imperative in the Greek
- All are accountable to God and should live accordingly
- We should have a godly response to life situations

- Living for Christ means joy now and reward in eternity
