# **Developing Implications from the Text**

## Three Main Considerations

- 1. How does the principle confront **unbiblical perspectives**? Communicate the antithesis to the biblical perspective
- 2. What **unholy motivations** does the principle expose? What are the **idolatries** that rule those motivations?
- 3. What am I not "putting off" that **hinders** "putting on" what the text teaches?

# Five Contrasts for Meditation

#### 1. Reasoning: Eternal vs Temporal

- a. Would this principle have changed the original hearers' reasoning from worldly/temporal to heavenly/eternal?
- b. How should this truth change/confront your worldly or temporal thinking?

#### 2. Worldview: God-Centered vs Man-Centered

- a. Would this principle have exposed man-centered worldviews?
- b. How does this confront your man-centered worldviews?

### 3. Theology: Sound vs Shallow

- a. Would this principle have cemented new theological convictions and/or exposed bad theology?
  - What flaw in my theological understanding is exposed by this principle?
- b. How should this truth confront and/or shape your theology?

### 4. Motivations: Christlike vs Sinful

- a. Would this principle have immediately brought the hearer's sinful motivations under the captivity of Christ?
- b. What sinful motivations do you have that need to be brought captive to this truth?

#### 5. Worship: True vs False

- a. Would this principle directly attack potential idolatries in the hearts of the original audience?
- b. What idols are exposed in your heart?
