In godly Joshua's last charge to the Israelites, he commanded them to "Choose you this day whom ye will serve; whether the gods which your fathers served that were on the other side of the flood, or the gods of the Amorites, in whose land ye dwell; but as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord." (Joshua 24:15)

Joshua had been Moses' minister and "right hand man." Upon Moses' death, the Lord placed Joshua in charge of the Israelites to lead them into Canaan, the Land of Promise, to possess their possessions. What a task lay before him! He proved to be a faithful and able leader and expert military strategist. He and Caleb were the only two of the twelve spies who gave an encouraging report urging the nation to go in at Kadesh Barnea and possess the land. He was a man of courage, faith, and godliness. He is one of the few people in the Bible about which nothing negative is recorded. What a pattern of good works he was.

Notice his urgency here in this final charge. It is an imperative: "Choose you today." Now is the time. We are to never put off obedience to the will and command of God. They had wasted forty-plus years in disobedience. Lost time can never be regained. Shakespeare wrote this about the subject:

There is a tide in the affairs of men,
Which taken at the flood, leads on to fortune;
Omitted, all the voyage of their life
Is bound in shallows and miseries.

God will have His way. He works His sovereign will in spite of our disobedient delays. How much better to obey quickly, fully, and willingly. King Saul had to be reminded of this: "Hath the Lord as great delight in burnt offerings and sacrifices, as in obeying the voice of the Lord? Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice, and to hearken than the fat of rams. For rebellion is as the sin of witchcraft, and stubbornness is as the iniquity and idolatry." (I Sam 15:22-23) Someone has written this:

You can note the maturity of a Christian by the decisions he makes. Holiness is making right decisions; carnality is making wrong ones...when Satan tempts us, we decide either to say "yes" or "no." We decide to take advantage of the opportunity to witness, to read the Bible, and to pray. It is not a matter of having the time but of taking the time, and taking the time requires a decision. Everything in a believer's life is an opportunity to glorify God. Right choices are made on the basis of right faith. Often we cannot see the consequences of our choices. We know it is the right choice because it is God's will, even before we see the results. God's will is the only reason we need.

The biblical priority for all matters in a believer's life is Matt 6:33, "But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you."

May we seek His will in all things and choose wisely and act quickly to fulfill His wishes.

The Brinkman Adventures is an exciting dramatized radio show that tells true, modern, missionary stories through the eyes of the fictional Brinkman family. The idea for the program began in 2009 while Ian Bultman was praying and reading his Bible. Ian was impressed to create a children's radio show that would inspire future missionaries. This show would later be known as The Brinkman Adventures. Ian wrote the first three stories, and his children volunteered as voice actors along with additional voice actors from the Milwaukee, Wisconsin area. Over time, God sent other talented actors and producers to help with production. Soon after, radio stations in the US began broadcasting the series, and today these weekly programs are heard on stations across the globe. The Brinkman Adventures now include ten seasons, with over 100 episodes including a thirteen-episode series about the pursuit of freedom by William Bradford and the American Pilgrims. Through the eyes of the Mayflower pilgrims, listeners will learn about their high value of Scripture, their horrific voyage across the Atlantic, and God's providence as they resettled in America. Children, as well as adults, will be reminded that they, too, are strangers and pilgrims who must keep their eyes fixed upon the God who cares about them, no matter their circumstances. Although the Brinkman family and some of the events in the stories are fictitious, each episode is based on true missionary accounts from around the world. The adventures take us to Papua New Guinea, Ecuador, Russia, Iraq, Mexico, Australia, Zambia, the Congo, and Cambodia, just to name a few. Each episode is filled with humor and excitement, and they will warm your heart to the great adventure of gospel missions. You will get a close-up view through the theater of the mind to an open window of the real-life challenges that modern-day missionaries face as they go to the ends of the world to preach the gospel of Jesus Christ. But the audience knows that Nick Guy is incompetent and that DeSoto, his companion, is actually the one who solves the cases.
