Who may come to the Lord's Table?

- 1) Have you been baptized in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit?
- 2) Have you publicly professed your faith in Jesus Christ, and do you embrace the Christian faith as summarized in the Apostles' Creed?
- 3) Are you presently a member in good standing of a Bible-believing, gospel-preaching church?

If you can affirm these questions sincerely, the elders welcome you to the Lord's Table! But if you have any hesitation at all, then we would encourage you to refrain from taking the Lord's Supper today. Reflect on the preached Word, Pray for God draw you closer to the Lord Jesus Christ, and come talk to the pastor or an elder.

How do I learn more about joining the church?

The Pastor offers membership classes periodically. This class introduces interested visitors to the beliefs of our church and life together in this church family. Please contact Pastor Jud if you are interested in attending a class.

The Nursery & Training Room

We do not have a staffed nursery or separate children's ministry. Instead, we welcome your children to be in worship with us! Their presence is a joy to us. But we know that not all children can sit quietly through service, so we do have both a nursery and a training room. Our nursery is located in the last room on the left at the end of hallway. This separate space has the audio and video being streamed in for you while you change, nurse, or comfort your baby or toddler up to around 3 years old. Additionally, we have a training room located in the back of the auditorium. This space was designed as a refuge in which to train your young children to both sit quietly and participate as appropriate throughout the service.

Ben Castanada – Edinburgh Theological Seminary

Ben Castaneda is serving in Edinburgh, Scotland as a lecturer in Greek and New Testament at Edinburgh Theological Seminary (ETS). Though Scotland is the birthplace of Presbyterianism, it has grown to be an un-churched and de-churched nation. ETS is committed to raising up and training faithful, evangelical ministers and Bible scholars to reach Scotland, the UK, and Europe with the Gospel. Ben is committed to this cause. Additionally, since Ben is an ordained minister in the PCA, the Castaneda family is committed to supporting the local church in Edinburgh, which includes many church planting efforts.

Here are Ben's current prayer requests:

Please pray for their church, a Free Church of Scotland congregation in Edinburgh.

- 1) The church is without a pastor (and has been for some time), so please pray for God to supply a shepherd to that congregation. Despite this, it is still growing in size, with up to 80 worshippers on a Sunday morning. It is also growing in diversity, with both native Scots and immigrants from India, Nigeria, and South Africa. Please join in praising God for His providence as He grows this congregation!
- 2) Please pray for the spiritual growth of the church. Pray that the church will have an atmosphere of grace amongst those attending, as they welcome new people who come, and in how they use their space during the week.
- 3) Please pray for a deacon at the church who is unsure about his calling to be an elder. (The other elders/members see him as clearly capable of taking on this responsibility, but he is hesitant to do so.)

Please pray for the Castanedas' neighbor, Igor, a retired scientist who defected from the USSR to England during the cold war. He is accepting of other people "being religious" but says it is not for him. Please pray that God will open Igor's eyes to his need for salvation and open his heart to the Gospel of Christ.

The Castaneda family recently received notice that the rent on their house will be going up. They have been happy in this rental house, but feel that this notification is a nudge towards seeking a house they can buy. Please pray that God will lead them to the house He has for them in which they can continue to serve both their church and the ETS students and community.

Finally, please pray for the Castaneda family: Ben, his wife, Bethel, and their 5 children.

Library Spotlight

Redemption Accomplished and Applied by John Murray

The atonement is the very center of the Christian faith. The free and sovereign love of God is the source of the accomplishment of redemption, as the Bible's most familiar text makes clear. "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life." Few recent interpreters have explored the biblical passages dealing with the necessity, nature, perfection, and extent of the atonement as penetratingly or precisely as Professor Murray. Part II of this book deals with the distinct steps to be identified in the Bible's presentation of how the redemption accomplished by Christ is applied progressively to the life of the redeemed. Here are helpful expositions of the scriptural teachings about calling, regeneration, faith and repentance, justification, adoption, sanctification, perseverance, union with Christ, and glorification.
