1 JOHN

- Author: John, disciple whom Jesus loved (Jn 13:23; 19:26; 20:2; 21:7, 20)
- Background: 85-95 AD
 - 1. Synoptic Gospels of Matthew (Prophecies), Mark (Power), & Luke (Parables) written 50-70 AD
 - 2. John's Gospel emphasizes Person of Christ (80-90 AD)
 - Equal to God (signs, relation to Father)
 - Nature of Christ (God and Man)
- Content: Refuting Gnosticism (a false teaching)
 - 1. Matter (therefore man's body) is evil & spirit (therefore God) is good
 - 2. Jesus didn't have body (just "seemed" to) OR
 - Was man only at birth
 - Was God & man at baptism (Spirit came as dove)
 - Was man only again at death ("Father, into Your hands I commit my spirit.")
 - 3. Sinning isn't evil-matter is
 - 4. Salvation is escaping body by knowledge of this, taught to select few (not faith in Jesus for all)

Proclamation of Church (1:1-4)

- 1. What—Jesus (1-2; Jn 6:69; 20:30-31; Co 1:28)
 - True God from beginning (Ge 1:1-3; Jn 1:1-3)
 - True Man—heard, seen, touched
 - Word (Jn 1:1-3)—in Greek philosophy, "logos" referred to rational principle of order & knowledge, governing cosmos
- 2. Why—fellowship (3-4)
 - With God (Co 1:21-23)
 - With believers (Ac 2:42-47)
 - Edification of spirit (1 Co 14:26)
 - Support for soul (1 Co 12:26)
 - Care for bodily needs (Ph 4:13-19)
 - Brings joy (Lk 2:10)—gladness in spiritual reality over external reality
- Walking in God's Light as disciple (1:5-2:11; Jn 8:12)
 - 1. Confession vs. Denial (1:9, Nu 32:23; Ga 6:7)
 - Honesty in claims with others, self, & God (1:6, 8, 10)

LOVE LESSON 1 • GOD'S LOVE

- Initiating (Ro 5:8; 1 Jn 4:10)
- Unconditional (Ep 2:4-5)
 - 1. All other religions work oppositely (conditionally)
- To be shared (1 Jn 4:7, 11, 19)
 - 1. Factors in our capacity to love
 - Our personality
 - Our upbringing (love shown as child)
 - Our reaction to circumstances (Flesh vs. Spirit)
- Remember
 - 1. Child of God with Spirit (Ep 5:1-2; Ga 5:22)
 - 2. Event + Attitude (Flesh vs. Spirit) = Reaction
 - 3. Responder or Initiator? (Mt 5:46-47)
