# The old self is the unregenerate person


Rom 6:6; 6:4-8;

Gal 2:20

#### The Self - Timeline of My Life

"the "old man" is what we were "in Adam," the "man" of the old era, who lives under the tyranny of sin and death" (Douglas Moo, *Romans 1-8*, p. 390)

It is "not a part of me called my old nature, but the whole of me as I was before I was converted...my preconversion life, my unregenerate self" (John Stott, *Men Made New*, p. 45)



## Isaiah 55:7

God calls the sinner to "forsake his way, and the unrighteous man his thoughts; and let him return to the Lord, and He will have compassion on him...and He will abundantly pardon"

What happened to the old self?

The believer's old self has been put to death (Rom 6:3-6; Gal 2:20)

The old self has already been put off at conversion (Col 3:9; Eph 4:22; 2 Cor 5:17)

What does this mean for believers?

Sin is no longer our master

Rom 6:6-7, 14, 17-18



# What does the Bible say about the new self (lit., the new man)?

The new self is the regenerate person (Col 3:10)

The new self is a new creation (2 Cor 5:17; Eph 4:24)

The new self lives by faith in Christ (Gal 2:20)

#### What happened to the new self?

The new man has already been put on (Col 3:10; Rom 6:4)

The new self is being constantly renewed (Eph 4:23; Col 3:10)

This new life gives us hope (Rom 6:22)

Since believers now have put on the new self, what does this mean for us?

We must live in entirely new ways (Rom 6:4; 2 Cor 5:17; Eph 4:24; Col 3:12-17)

We must no longer walk in sin (Rom 6:2; Eph 4:17-19)

# If we have a new self, is indwelling sin something we still have to deal with?

Fighting sin is a current earthly reality for the believer (2 Cor 5:2-4; Rom 8:23)

We will make real progress against sin in this life (Rom 8:11)

One day God will deal the final blow that will end our battle with sin (Rom 8:30; 1 Cor 15:42-50
