Walk in the divine kind of love

I. Become imitators of God (1)

Steadily advance toward perfect imitation of God

"Beloved"

- An only child who enjoyed ALL of their parents' love
- Never had to share their parents' love
- Could refer to being contented
- Used for "only son" in Gen 22:2, 12, 16
- Used for Jesus, God's only, beloved Son Mt 3:17; 17:5
- God is able to direct His love to each one of us as if we are His only child!

As beloved children...

Being so intensely loved ought to compel you to love intensely

Develop a reputation for loving

In your intense, intimate oneto-one relationship with God, imitate Him

"Children"

Little children who were dependent on their parents
It expresses a close, tender relationship to the parent

In this tender, dependent relationship with God, imitate Him

Walk in the divine kind of love

I. Become imitators of God (1)II. To imitate Him, walk in love (2a)

"Love" (Agapé)

- It is not driven by impulse or external stimuli
- It deliberately chooses to act as a free choice
- It is not prompted by loveliness or worthiness in the recipient (they don't have to earn or deserve your love)
- It seeks the highest good of the other person
- Godly love gives and serves

Godly love (agapé)

"Love engages your neighbor's specific personal needs and struggles. Love encompasses many things: attitudes of patience and kindness; actions that meet material needs and offer a helping hand. And love includes honest conversation...candid, verbal problem solving, in contrast with the judgmentalism, avoidance, bitterness, and aggression that come so easily"

Walk in the divine kind of love

I. Become imitators of God (1)
II. To imitate Him, walk in love (2a)
III. Jesus is our supreme model for walking in sacrificial love (2b)

Jesus loved you all the while He hung on that cross bleeding for you The Son of God "loved me, and delivered Himself up for me"

Jesus said "the good shepherd lays down His life for the sheep"

"Greater love has no one than this, that one lay down his life for his friends"
