

#### Nourish

- To nurture
- The full-orbed parenting involved in raising a child to maturity

#### Cherish

- Caring for someone
- Taking tender care of someone (1 Thess 2:7)

# Christ's nurturing and tender care for the Church in Ephesians

He redeemed it (Eph 1:7-12; 2:1-10)

He sealed it (1:13-14)

He empowered it (1:19-23)

He brought it into one body (2:16)

He filled it with God's fulness (3:19)

He gifted it (4:7-16)

He loved and sanctified it (5:25-26)

"He nurses her with the warmth of his love and power so that she will be able to cope in the world" (Harold Hoehner, *Ephesians*, p. 768)
