Stages in child rearing

Early stages - submission to authority, obedience and behavior are the focus, little children can understand “no” but not heart issues



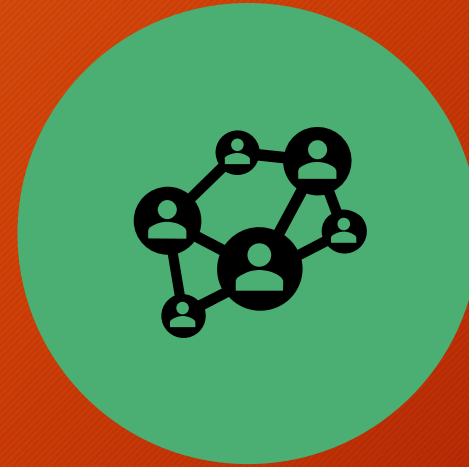
Middle stages - focus on God’s requirement of obeying from the heart, the internal struggle is at the forefront of the training process
